Typically, data are gathered from a variety of sources and by using several different methods (e.g., Observations & interviews). The case study is not itself a research method, but researchers select methods of data collection and analysis that will generate material suitable for case studies. The case study method often involves simply observing what happens to, or reconstructing 'the case history' of a single participant or group of individuals (such as a school class or a specific social group).

## Definition

According to H. Odum, "The case study method is a technique by which individual factor whether it be an institution or just an episode in the life of an individual or a group is analyzed in its relationship to any other in the group."

Pauline V. Young describes case study as "a comprehensive study of a social unit be that unit a person, a group, a social institution, a district or a community."

## CHARACTERISTICS OF CASE STUDY:

- I. Under this method the researcher can take one single social unit or more of such units for his study purpose; he may even take a situation to study the same comprehensively.

### Case study

Case study involves a detailed in-depth analysis of an organization, person, a group, an event, allowing an understanding of complex phenomena, such as organizations. A case study generally involves looking at a single case (which already exists), an object of study which is easily identified and separated (a bounded system) from other similar objects e.g., an organization, a place, an illness in one patient. Case study is a useful methodology for focusing on relationships connecting everyday practices in natural settings, placing attention on a local situation. Research questions revolve around 'How?' or 'Why?' and may be explanatory, exploratory or descriptive in nature. The case study is useful to investigate an issue in depth and 'provide an explanation that can cope with the complexity and subtlety of real of life situation'.

### Definitions

- Charles H Cooley says that 'Case study deepens perception and gives a clear insight into life.'
- Pauline Young opines that "it is a method of exploring and analyzing the life of a social unit-be it a person, a family, an institution, cultural group or even an entire community."
- Goode and Hatt say "Case Study is a way of organising social data so as to preserve the unitary character of social object being studied."

### Characteristics

The essential characteristics of the case study method are as under:

1. The researcher can take one single social unit or more of such units for his study purpose, may even take a situation to study the same comprehensively.
2. To obtain enough information for drawing correct inferences.
3. To make a complete study of the social unit covering all facets.
4. Try to understand the complex factors that are operative within a social unit as an integrated totality.
5. The approach happens to be qualitative and not quantitative. Mere quantitative information is not collected. Every possible effort is made to collect information concerning all aspects of life
6. To know the mutual inter-relationship of causal factors.
