Mr Abhishek Srivastava discussed different aspects of new ventures including funding and apprised student with start-up ideas through different examples like google pay, Cashify etc. He emphasized that some of the start-ups consider that mentorship is more important than financiers. No doubt that connections play a very important role but thorough research before starting the venture is really important aspect. It is necessary to understand the Funding Landscape. Largely, friends, family and relatives are first one to whom start-up approach for funding. There are two types of investors i.e., Angel investor who ask for equity partnership while VC funding comes from group of people who are in the business of funding. They will dictate their terms and conditions to the start-up while angel investors invest only if they like the idea. Start-ups can ask for funding at early stage of ideation, growth stage after prototype has been launched and late-stage funding for expansion of the startup.

Outcome: Students interacted with the resource person and got the idea of start-up and whom to approach for funding.

Conclusion: The session was interesting and interactive and Mr. Srivastava was able to explain the funding landscape through deliberation of examples.

Further Scope: Students who are interested in start-up can get further direction by discussing their idea with resource person

The objective of this FDP on E-content development was to understand the meaning and standards of E-content, learning objects, designing and development of digital resources for teaching and learning. Thus, this FDP aimed at providing the knowledge and skill to teachers to cater to present day learners and their learning styles. The FDP discussed the four quadrant approach of e-content development and online open resources were also discussed.

Day-wise Report of the Sessions Conducted

Monday April 29, 2023

Inaugural Session:

Prof. Vimal Rarh welcomed organisers, guests and participants by presenting them e-bouquet. She introduced her team to the participants. Prof Dubey, Vice Chancellor, K.R. Mangalam University was invited as Chief Guest, delivered his speech. He emphasized on the fact teaching learning process revolves around creativity and passion of teacher to give his best to students. MOOC stated as it will not only improve gross enrolment ratio in the country but also it provides opportunity to students to listen to good academician who are best in their discipline. With devotion and passion, faculty can create e-content for different portals with the help pf subject knowledge, creativity and technology.




Photo 2: Key note address by Prof. Bakshi




Photo 3: 21st century skills as explained by Prof. Bakshi




Photo 4: Impact of ICT on various sectors of Higher Education

Day 2: May 1, 2023

Session 1: Four Quadrant Format for E-content & MOOC by Prof. Vimal Rarh

After introduction of experts, FDP began with Prof. Vimal Rarh session on Development of E-content for MOOC and online session. She laid emphasis on creation of e-content development through four quadrant approach. She emphasized on the fact that flip classroom can help students in preparing for subject in a better way by fulfilling the requirement of graduate attribute and attainment of program outcome. Multimedia enrichment through audio, video, Visuals, Animation, Simulation, graphics etc. along with static content like text, images, graphics etc. result in to e-content.

She reiterated that preparation of e-content needs to be done from learner's point of view. The process needs to be fast. Combination of senior and junior teachers along with technical team must work on the development of e-content. Use of correct visuals/animations must be there so as to create impact. Proper methodology for development of e-content must be used otherwise non standardized content will be generated. Content must be original, must express author's view point and free from plagiarism.




Photo 6: Prof Vimal elaborating methodology and authenticity of e-content

Session 2: Higher Education by Plenary Speaker Prof. Ved Prakash

Prof. Ved Prakash explained the historical aspect of Higher Education. Idea of faculties gained momentum in 19th century through Humboldtian Model which continued till 20th century. Humboldt believed that the university (and education in general, as in the Prussian education system) should enable students to become autonomous individuals and world citizens by developing their own reasoning powers in an environment of academic freedom Structure of Disciplines, Self-Governance, Academic Freedom and research were part of this model. Later on, interdisciplinary and collaborative research came in to force. New disciplines emerged and concept of Certificate, diploma, Degree came in to existence. Numbers of higher Education institutions are quite large in India. As technology is advancing at a very fast pace and education needs to metamorphized to bear the impact of changing technology. The session was mesmerizing and it was always a delight to listen the speaker.

Day 3: May 2, 2023

Session 1: Presentation Tools and Multimedia Enrichment by Dr Arun Jhulka

Session on Presentation Tools and Multimedia Enrichment was taken up by Dr Arun Jhulka, Associate Professor at Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi. He explained the usage of mind map, Canva (free online design tools), e- draw etc. for preparation and creation of original presentation which is essential component of four quadrant approach of e-content development. During the session, Dr Arun Julka emphasized the importance of using high-quality images and videos in presentations. He advised participants to avoid using blurry images and limited animated videos, and instead, focus on using simple and visually appealing layouts.

Next, Dr Julka taught participants how to choose different design layouts for their slides and add random text using the "Rand(x,y)" and "Lorem(x,y)" commands. He also demonstrated how to add sections, rotate text, and use filler text to enhance the visual appeal of the presentation.

Dr Julka also showed participants various options available in the Quick Access toolbar which has command options in that one of the command options which allow the system to read out the text automatically. He also demonstrated how to use the pointer, mind maps, and insert screenshots to generate mind images.

Moreover, he explained how to design tables, insert pictures, and format them. Participants also learned how to use the "CTL + Drag and Duplicate" feature to duplicate slides quickly and efficiently. Additionally, he showed how to put shapes into groups to use as whole images and capture videos to make presentations more interactive.

Overall, the hands-on session conducted by Mr. Arun Julka was informative and engaging, and the participants found it extremely helpful. They gained new skills and techniques to enhance their multimedia presentations and create impactful visual content.

The session was interesting and opened plethora of opportunities for creation of impactful creative presentation through online design tools available free of cost.




Photo 8: Dr Jhulka explaining learning objectives of Power point Presentation




Photo 9: Dr Jhulka demonstrating the use of open software Canva to draw PPTs

Session 2: Forms of E-Content by Prof. Vimal Rarh

Prof. Vimal Rarh gave a lecture on MOOCs and E-content Development. During the lecture, she discussed the various components of e-content, such as pre-requisites, learning outcomes,

introduction, concept explanation, solved/guided examples, formative assessment of different types and difficulty levels, summary, summative assessment, and others.

Prof. Rarh emphasized that the e-content for a 4-credit course should consist of 35-40 small topics or subtopics, which are called modules. The overall target of development is around 20 hours of video and 20 hours of non-videos. To ensure the quality of e-content, Prof. Rarh suggested that every module should have four components: self-learn, e-text, know more, and self-assessment.

Regarding the e-text component, Prof. Rarh specified that it should be around 10-14 pages of typed content (inclusive of images), with around 3000 words, Times New Roman, font size 11, and single spacing. She also emphasized the importance of using keywords, metatags, and file name tagging to enhance the discoverability of e-content.

To make the e-content more engaging, Prof. Rarh also discussed the importance of multimedia coverage and enrichment of self-learn presentation form, as well as the use of storyboards for animation and screen capture software. She also shared some tips on how to record videos, such as choosing a quiet and well-lit location, using a good-quality microphone, and rehearsing the script before recording.

In summary, Prof. Rarh's lecture provided valuable insights into the various components of econtent and how to develop high-quality e-content for MOOCs. The lecture was informative and engaging, and the audience benefited greatly from the knowledge and experience shared by Prof. Rarh.




Photo10: Methodology of introduction of topics through ppts or GIF animations

Day 4 Report: May 3, 2023

Session 1: Structured Delivery of e- content on LMS By Prof Vimal Rarh

Introductory video of 3-5 minutes is very important and act as a trailer of the course and should be prepared using multimedia tools and must contain start and end of the course, number of modules, Activities, Quizzes, Assignment etc.

Week wise title of the subjects is to be allocated. The Week must include module title and video, e text and additional reading and discussion forum. Brief profile of speaker is also put up. The introductory video must capture the interest of the readers so that more number of learners is registered for the course. She also explained how to write proposal for MOOC for Consortium of Educational Communication (CEC). Different types of hardware and software tools are required to prepare videos and editing of videos. It is better to create small video which can be edited further to remove noise and increase the quality of video. She also explained that for project approval from CEC, expression of interest format needs to be filled along with introductory video, profile of speaker. She deliberated upon the Teacher's Manual guide, regarding the introduction and flow of course, teacher presentation like videos and presentations, assignment, assessment and extra study material. 21st century skills are communication, creativity, collaboration, use of technology




Photo 11: Structure of MOOC




Photo 12: e- Content for 4 Quadrant Approach




Photo 13: Teacher's e- Kit


Session 2: Assessment and Examination Reforms by Prof. A.K. Bakshi

Prof A.K. Bakshi talked on Assessment and Examination Reforms. Apart from curriculum and teaching learning process, assessment and evaluation forms the third important constituent. Change of assessment is needed from primitive or conventional ways of assessment to 21st century assessment tools which require different skill sets. Method of assessment should be scientific, to encourage multiple skills like analysis, conceptual clarity, competence, creativity amongst students. Both summative and formative assessment needs to be integrated with Bloom's Taxonomy. Emphasis should be on development of cognitive, affective and creative skills amongst users. Indian Education system has not changed much over a period of time. Evaluation Rubrics play a very pivotal role for assessment and grading. Now a- days innovative Open Book Examination are being promoted as it promotes higher order thinking.

21st century skills are critical thinking, creativity, collaborations, communications (learning Skills), information and use of technology (Literacy Skills), flexibility, leadership, initiative, productivity and social (life Skills). To generate these skills in the students, highly competent teachers are required. More than one crore teachers are there in higher education and training them to impart quality education to students is a very difficult task. The judgement of students' knowledge is done through question papers which should be designed as per bloom's taxonomy and promote creativity and high order thinking. Rote learning needs to be curbed. It is better to assess students through MCQs. MCQs are best to judge first four levels of Bloom's taxonomy but to assess creativity and design, project-based teaching is best. Ultimately 360-degree multidimensional holistic development approach for student is required in which technology plays a big role. Technology is enabler and it cannot take the place of teacher.




Photo 14: Prof Bakshi explaining the concept of competency




Photo 18: Holistic Progress Card




Photo 19: Four Pronged strategy for Assessment

Day 5: May 4, 2023

Session 1: How to make videos by Dr Jhulka

Dr Jhulka elaborated **How to make videos** through Clip champ Video editor. The session was hands on. It was captivating and interesting and provided thorough understanding about the use of free online tools for video editing.

Session 2: Session on development of Teachers e- Kit by Prof. Rarh

Prof Rarh conducted session on development of Teachers e- Kit which comprises of Teacher's Manual, videos and ppts, assignments and additional material. Teacher's e-kit is

integration of subject, ICT and pedagogy of blended teaching learning approach. Teacher's Manual talks about delivery process of lecture like introduction of topic, contents of lecture, how to make it interesting. Presentation involves use of PPts audio and video, 3D materials etc. Assignment questions should be based on Blooms taxonomy and must Program outcome and course outcome mapping. Additional materials involve value addition, extra learning material, online resources, crosswords, puzzles, point to ponder etc. In the end disclaimer must be there claiming the originality of the e-content. Overall, the session provided thorough understanding about design of teacher's e-Kit and its essential components.

Unique templates have been evolved for each quadrant which provide a base of pedagogy and ICT tools as a framework for integration with subject, given as under:

- Quadrant I: Teachers' Manual This guides a teacher on how to teach a topic effectively with emphasis on pre-requisites, learning-outcomes, delivery process for implementing the Flipped Classroom Methodology (Getting Started, how to introduce the topic, how to make it interesting, what text material or video to be given for Self-learning as Homework to student, what to discuss in the classroom, what assignments and quizzes to be provided, how to differentiate different types of learners etc.).
- to differentiate different types of learners etc.).

 2. Quadrant II: Teachers' Presentation and video for Flipped Classroom- The presentation can be used for teaching in the classroom (face to face or online) and the video for Flipped Classroom can be provided as Homework to learners beforehand.
- Quadrant III: Teachers' Assignments This comprises of Subjective questions and Objective Questions tagged with revised Bloom's Taxonomy levels and CO-PO mapping as per Outcome based Education. These questions can be used to create various assignments and quitzes as per different types of learners.
- 4. Quadrant IV: Teachers' Know More-This comprises of value additions a teacher should know to infuse creativity amongst the learner and to meet the curricular provisions for the holistic development of the learner. These include amongst others some common misconceptions, did you know, points to ponder, activities or do yourself, interesting facts, crosswords, etc.

Session 3: Session on assessment and evaluation by Prof. Ved Prakash, Former Chairman of UGC

Prof. Ved Prakash, Former Chairman of UGC deliberated a session was on **assessment and evaluation** of students. He explained that there is need to understand the limitations of assessment tools. There exists difference between different type of learners on the basis of psychology of the learners. We need to empower students belonging to some social groups by providing them extra classes. There should be healty competition between learners rather than stress of studies. Learners must develop higher order thinking without losing the essence of conceptual understanding. The assessment must be on scientific basis which are reliable, valid, usable and objective. Setting of question paper is art as well as science. Question paper must cover the whole syllabus and must involve different type of objective and subjective questions. It must discourage selective study habits. Compulsory question gives more focus on that part of content from where question has been framed. Unambiguous questions are not required. Question must invoke intended response. Session was well articulated and structured to involve listener's interest.

Day 6: May 5, 2023

Session 1: Teacher's e-Kit quadrant II and III by Prof. Rarh

Teacher's assignments are important component. Questions in the assignment can be based on True/False, MCQs, ordering of question, sequences of mechanism, assertation and reasoning questions and many more. Topics for self-study mode are to be identified. Additional reading material is to be provided. Videos from OER can be shared with students and encourage student interaction. Rubrics for evaluation are to be prepared. Share interesting facts or games, numerical problems with students and guide them how to solve it. More number of formative tests, automated excels, projects, case studies can be given to students. Ultimately CO/PO mapping is to be done and gap analysis is to be done.




Photo 21: Different type of MCQs




Photo 22: Rubrics for Evaluation




Photo 24: CO/PO mapping

Objective

- To explore the changes required in the role of teachers in the present time.
- To analyse the need for curriculum-based changes.
- To compare the role of teachers under NEP 2020 with other previous policies.
- To understand the role of technology in improving the status of teaching.

Methodology

A panel discussion was organised by bringing eminent speakers and educationalists on the same platform. Five panelists were there, and they discussed various aspects of the role of a teacher with reference to the new policy on education.

Content

The session started with a welcome note by the session moderator, Dr.Pooja Verma. All the experts were then introduced to the participants. All the panelists were enthusiastic about answering each question.

• Panelists provided some suggestions that may be considered by the government for better implementation of the policy.







These legal rights deliberate about exclusive right that is given to the inventor/creator to fully apply his invention/creation for a given period of time. It may be authorship right of a book or article, a distinctive logo or design representing a company and its products, unique design elements of a web site, or a patent on a particular process.

"According to the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), China made as many as 13,38,503 patent applications, with just 10% being made by non-resident Chinese, the USA made 605,571 patent applications, while India made a mere 45,057, of which over 70% were by non-resident Indians". We are only good at providing service to anyone. This is embedded in our blood. Now it is time to change it.

The Controller General of Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (CDPDTM), Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India has launched a "National Intellectual property Awareness Mission (NIPAM)" with an aim to impart IPR Awareness. University Grants Commission (UGC) has asked universities and colleges to organize an IPR awareness training programme for a better understanding of the patent filing process. UGC and Education ministry is aiming to train one million students in IPR filing by August 15, 2022.

Objective:

- To create awareness amongst faculty and research scholars about the concept of Intellectual Property Rights
- To acquaint faculty the difference between Copyright and IPR

Content of the event:

In continuation with our efforts to create awareness amongst faculty members and research scholars about Intellectual Property Rights as per directives of UGC, IQAC of university organized this online seminar as a part of collaborative activity with Pulatsya Legal firm with which MOU has been signed. On 9 April 2022, this online seminar on 'Intellectual Property Rights with Focus on Copyright and Patent' through Zoom was organized. The seminar started with the welcome address by Prof. Kiran Bala, Dean, School of Journalism and Mass Communication, KRMU. Mr. Abhishek Sharma, Managing Partner, Pulatsya Legal Firm, Bangalore, conducted the seminar.

He educated the faculty members and research scholars about copyright, patent and trademark. Through this seminar, participants got to know about what can be patentable and what is not. He shared interesting examples of marketing, branding and film production to make participants understand the concept. He also made aware about the differences between authorship and ownership. He discussed about four different types of patents Utility patent, Provisional patent, Design patent, and Plant patent.

He focused on Copyright which is an automatic right which protects original literary, dramatic, musical and artistic works. A Patent is a registered right that gives the owner exclusive right to


features and processes of inventions. A Trade Mark protects logos and signs that are used in relation to a particular type of product or service.


He cited several inventions that have not been patented. He also provided understanding about patent filing process.




Day 3 Session: 29 July 2022


