The orientation Session on CO-PO mapping was conducted on April 8, 2023 in room No A 213, A Block. Prof Pankaj Agarwal introduced the concept of Outcome based Education to the faculty and emphasized that the primary change in outcome-based education is from a teacher-centric to a learner-centric approach. We now put focus on the product rather than not the process. While the student is the item that needs to be shaped into a finished product, the instructor is an integral aspect of the process. This is accomplished by concentrating on what the student needs to learn and how much he has already learned.

It implies that we should be aware of what a student needs to learn in advance. "Outcomes" are the statements that result from these. Knowing how much student has learnt is the second goal, and this is only feasible if the "outcomes" are quantifiable.


This implies that teachers must always have a clear objective in mind regarding what they want their pupils to know, comprehend, and be able to do. In other words, teachers should concentrate on assisting students in acquiring the knowledge, abilities, and personalities that will enable them to attain the clearly stated planned outcomes.

Bloom's Taxonomy

- Bloom taxonomy provides a set of measurable verbs to describe and classify observable knowledge, skills, attitudes, behaviors and abilities.
- Measurable verbs are used to create learning outcomes, which can be measured

According to Bloom taxonomy, Learning can be divided into three domains:

Cognitive

- Knowledge Outcomes: What do students know?
 - Skill Outcomes: What can students do?

Affective

- Attitude and Value Outcomes: Ethics, Diversity, personal identity, motivation,.....
- Behavioral Outcomes: Persistence, societal concerns, collaborative activities,......








Photo 1: Prof Pankaj Agarwal interacting with faculty




Photo 2: Dr Manoj Ojha explain the CO-PO mapping to faculty




Photo 3: Concluding Remarks by Prof. C.S. Dubey, Vice Chancellor-KRMU

IQAC in collaboration with Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) had organized a training session with Ms Munmun Goel, Advocate as the resource person. Since ICC team had a new Chairperson and some new members, the training and orientation towards conducting inquiries was needed. Ms Munmun is also advocate member of ICC who is currently practicing. She conducted the session by introducing the need and constitution of Internal Complaints Committee. She introduced the concept of Harassment, both mental and physical in the context of ICC. Also, the term predator was introduced in cases of harassment and exploitation. All cases pertaining to ICC should be accepted in the form of a clearly written complaint by the complainant. The time to resolve cases should not exceed 60 days. For matters that do not indicate intent of sexual harassment both mental and physical may be directed to the Disciplinary Committee. According to Dr. Munmun, all complainants should be working women whose workplace is the University. The overall training session were enriching and very interactive for the faculties.







Internal Quality Assurance Cell, K.R. Mangalam University conducted an Orientation session "Role of IQAC and Good Documentation Practices". Resource Person Dr. Prashant R Nair emphasized that not only collection, collation, curation, consolidation and submission of data with evidences is important but it is also imperative to analyse the data so as to find out the quality of the process. Further measures can be adopted for upgrading the process based on analysis. This data is required for various ranking organisations. It is necessary to monitor and maintain data at department, school, and university level. IQAC role is to ensure quality sustenance and quality enhancement in the academic, and administrative processes. Decentralization and empowerment are best tools to achieve quality. It is important to identify the best practice of the institution that has been continued for significant amount of time, at least 2-3 years. He also explained about the criteria which are needed for identification of best practice and challenges associated with it. The impact of that identified best practice needs to be measured in multi dimensions. He also deliberated that affiliation of the university should be same for the purpose of research publications otherwise university may lose data due to variations of affiliations. Administrative staff may be appointed for data collection and adequate appraisal may be given to faculty to motivate them for administrative work. NAAC team of K.R. Mangalam University attended the session and asked several questions to gain clarity on the subject. The session was effective and impactful.





NAAC Awareness Programme

NAAC Awareness Programme for faculty was conducted in Moot Court on March 14, 2020, to apprise them about the procedure of data collection, and submission of SSR on NAAC portal. 105 faculty members were present in the session. Pro Vice Chancellor **Prof Anita Sharma** initiated the session and informed that university wants to apply for NAAC in December 2020 and our IQAC team is gathering and compiling information to fill Self Study Report of the university. She emphasised on the fact that it is now almost mandatory for each higher education institute to apply for NAAC accreditation, as it will help university to maintain quality benchmarks and will further help university to acquire funds from Govt. and Private organizations. It is duty of each faculty to help IQAC team in collection of data and suggest ways and means to improve functioning of the university.

Prof. Aditya Malik, Vice Chancellor KRMU said that new format that has been adopted by NAAC where assessment is no longer wholly depending on qualitative judgement of Peer Team but also a quantitative SSR submitted by the institutions. The submission of SSR is completely online and must be uploaded on the website. Payment of fees is also online, and all the communication needs to be done through the NAAC portal.

Data Validation and Verification is the next process for which third party agencies have been empanelled by the NAAC. The SSRs submitted are sent to the DVV agencies for validation. Proof of all the activities that have been conducted by university needs to be filed properly as they will be required at the time of DVV. The Student Satisfaction Survey is the feedback collected from the students of the college or university. At least 10% of the students should respond to the queries to carry forward the process. As the last step the peer team visit is organised by NAAC. The team visit ensures maximum objectivity. He also emphasized that student satisfaction survey is important part of SSR, and students must be made aware about it.

Ms Manvi Arora ultimately divided the task to different teams and more members were allocated to each team for collection and compilation of data. She thanked Leadership team for addressing this important issue and thanked faculty to be part of this session.

Education Summit on Meaningful education:Redefining Goal and Pedagogies

K.R. Mangalam university organized an education Summit titled towards Meaningful education: Redefining Goal and Pedagogies on 23rd December 2019 at India International Centre, New Delhi. the theme of the summit was new education Policy (NEP) issued by government of India to encourage a shift in the pedagogical practices prevalent in the country. The keynote address of the summit was delivered by Prof. Dinesh Singh, chancellor, who elucidated on the need for revival in methods of teaching. He cited the research by British economist Angus Maddison who had established that India's share of the world economy had declined from 24.4% in 1700 to 4.2% in 1950. The strength in India's pre-colonial economy lay in its emphasis on knowledge systems and practical applicability. Prof Singh reiterated that a student needs to be introduced to blended learning which will enable a learner to apply his knowledge in real life. He specifically emphasized on the need for trans-disciplinary learning in the education system. The summit consisted of four sessions of panel discussions. Each session consisted of discussions and deliberations by prominent personalities from academia and industry.
