In an another scene She removes an female abusive word from a hotel" to toler which represents that She is a modern lady who cannot compromise with her principles and doesn"t have the patience to tolerate ill happenings. The movie revolves around a case of Honour Killing of which Meera and her Husband Arjun become the witness, and in that struggle with people Arjun dies. In the end Meera avenge to the murderers of her Husband.

2. Raid (Corruption) /16 March 2018

After receiving an anonymous tip, Amay Patnaik (Ajay Devgan), a senior income tax officer, begins an investigation on an influential man in Lucknow for money laundering. The movie revolves around the black money saved by a Politician and the tantrums a politician uses to control the raid.



3. Table no. 21 (Ragging) / 4 January 2013

A couple is drawn into a game show with a whooping winning prize. However the game turns into more than a survival for them with **no** escape. Rajeev Khandelwal and Paresh Rawal play as the lead charecters. The movie tells about the consequences of Extent Ragging during College time.

4. Toilet- Ek Prem Katha (cleanliness) / 11 August 2017
