- I. - II. To encourage and conduct CSR and EPR activities with the funds received from individual, various Body corporate/Organization to promote, support and assist education and personal training program designed to enhance cleanliness, environmental information processing and utilization capabilities.

- IV. To Promoting, encouraging and initiating research related to the environment related issues.

The expression SJMC, KRMU and M4E shall, mean and include the Institutions/Organizations, their successors, appointees, assignees etc.

SCOPE OF THIS AGREEMENT

- This Agreement describes the understandings and commitments to this collaborative effort between the above mentioned two parties
- This agreement guides the collaboration for the period of 3 Years beginning from 17th November, 2021 to 16th November 2024.
- III. The scope and duration of the collaboration may be amended and/or extended through the joint agreement further with the consent and approval of both the parties.

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


