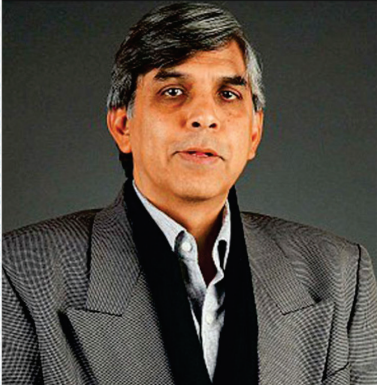

## INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

The IQAC Director conducted meetings with IQAC coordinators to orient them about curriculum development and enrich students' understanding of concepts. The following measures were undertaken.

### a) Curriculum Reforms:

**i) Environmental initiatives:** As environmental degradation is increasing day by day, it becomes mandatory for the university to enlighten students about the concept of carbon foot prints, climate change etc. The concept of environmental sustainability has been adopted by university students in letter and spirit through curricular and co-curricular activities. Workshops on waste management, recycling of waste/e-waste and tree plantation, organic farming, etc., have been conducted in the university.

**ii) Adoption of Project-based learning as Teaching Pedagogy:** In order to provide better understanding of concepts or fundamentals, it is better to adopt hands on learning for students. Group of students may work on interdisciplinary projects and learn by doing. Teacher may act as facilitator. To emphasize this pedagogy, evaluation reforms were carried out to assess students appropriately.

**iii) Continuous evaluation system—**It was recommended that students be evaluated continuously so that they focus on conceptual clarity and apply the skills learned in the classroom.

### b) Research Reforms:

- i) To promote interdisciplinary research, faculty and research scholars may connect with each other to identify common or complementary areas of research and work in unison to achieve their objectives.
- ii) **ROBOTICS LAB at KRMU in Collaboration with IIT Bombay:** e-Yantra is a project hosted by IIT Bombay to spread education in Embedded Systems and Robotics and is sponsored by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) through the National Mission on Education through ICT (NMEICT). e-Yantra Lab Setup Initiative (eLSI) is a college level program under which colleges are encouraged to setup robotics labs. It is designed as a scalable and sustainable approach that addresses infrastructure creation and teacher training – to create an eco-system at the colleges to impart effective engineering education.

**iii) Engineering Kitchen at KRMU:** A nucleus of the engineering kitchen, a hub for all students and faculty, particularly those involved in the innovation, invention and entrepreneurial activities has been established at KRM University. Its ambitious projects include preparation of single crystals of technologically important materials. Experiments on solution growth have already been performed by new innovative techniques. A crystal growth system from melt is being designed. For this a new innovative low-cost technique for fabrication of thermocouples has been demonstrated. Perfect looking whisker crystals of KCl have been grown by a novel technique. As an offshoot, facilities for recording spectra of constituent atoms of materials and impurities are planned to be established.

**c) Inculcation of moral and ethical values amongst students by portraying the ideologies of celebrated figures:** KRMU celebrated 149th birth Anniversary of ‘Father of the Nation’- Mahatma Gandhi by organizing a week-long celebration from **2 October to 9 October 2018**.

## Office of Dean Student Welfare

## K.R. Mangalam & Vision of India health camp big success

An increasing prevalence of diseases like (Diabetes) is seen in children and old people, specially in rural areas. This is a major health problem which warrants an urgent need for a health camp. On 22 April, Health Society, K.R. Mangalam University, under the guidance of students of Pharmacy Department of the University organized a health awareness camp at Government High School in Abhayapur. This program was organized by Dr. Arun Garg and Mrs. Silky Sethi. The mission of the camp was to facilitate a traditional camping experience in a medically safe environment.

The statistics for India are alarming:

- The prevalence of diabetes increased tenfold, from 1.2 % to 12.1%, between 1971 and 2000.
- It is estimated that 61.3 million people aged 20-79 years live with diabetes in India (2011 Estimates). The number is expected to increase to 101.2 million by 2030.
- And, 77.2 million people in India are said to have pre-diabetes

This check-up and awareness camp was supported by NGO Vision Of India. Hundreds of people and all the students of class 9th and 10th were thronging the camp for free Hemoglobin in blood, BMI (Body Mass Index), and blood pressure measurement.

The proportion of diabetic people was found to be significantly high at the camp, especially among women and most of the students were found with low amount of hemoglobin.

Though the awareness campaign was the central part of the camp, the students as volunteers also prescribed medicines and urged the patients to visit hospitals for further care. They advised the patients to add iron and protein rich food to their diet.

The camp coordinator Supriya Mishra and director Professor Silky Sethi addressed the students and villagers with regard to diet and nutrition and said that healthier food is very important. She also said that in future, more camps will be organized. Their main aim is to contribute to Healthy India Mission.

The teachers and students were highly appreciative of the camp and urged that such health check-ups and awareness camps be organized frequently.

## UNIVERSITY HOSTEL

The university hostel with 162 rooms would likely be a relatively large and comprehensive residential facility designed to accommodate many students. Some details of the hostel are presented below:

1. **Room Configuration:** Each hostel room is typically designed to accommodate four students having four single beds, along with desks, chairs, storage space, and possibly a shared bathroom.
2. **Location:** The university hostel is on campus, making it convenient for students to attend classes, use campus facilities, and engage in campus activities.
3. **Sports:** There are indoor games to play (pool, table tennis, badminton, and foosball), outdoor games to play (basketball, football, cricket, and long tennis), and a gym for health fitness and exercise.
4. **Amenities:** The hostel offers communal facilities to meet the needs of a larger number of residents. This can include a dining area for both (Boys and Girls), common areas for socializing and studying, laundry and clothes iron facilities, a centralised air conditioner, 24 x 7 Wi-Fi, a water dispenser for cold and hot filtered water, and possibly recreational areas.
5. **Security:** Considering the high number of students, security measures like electronic punching, surveillance cameras and a large team of 24 x 7 security personnel have been put in place for the security of both boys and girls, to ensure the safety and well-being of all the hostel residents.
6. **Hostel Staff:** With a larger hostel, there is a team of hostel wardens for both Boys and Girls hostel separately, chief warden hostels and hostel residents to provide support, organize events, and help to build a sense of community among students.
7. **Community Building:** The hostel administration organises events, workshops, and activities to help residents get to know each other and create a sense of community.
8. **Transport:** Transport facility for every weekend and holiday for hostel students who want to visit the nearby location.
9. **Accessibility:** The hostel has been designed to accommodate students with disabilities, providing accessible entrances, rooms, and facilities.

students work on live projects and deal with real-life issues on the ground. Some students are involved in research and documentation of urban villages for their steady decline due to the rapid urbanization across Sohna and Gurgaon. During the village research, students analyzed problems such as gender divide, waterlogging, and the environmental threat to Aravallis. They studied natural slopes, water catchment points, settlement patterns, and the social behavior of the population in the urban villages to suggest concrete solutions. Students have addressed gender ratio issues by providing community recreational spaces that are safe and welcoming for women and children.

Students experience collaborative learning in hybrid teams across batches to create innovative design solutions. This has proven to uplift learners' cognitive skills as individual designers and creative teams. Students have also participated in national-level competitions and received recognition for their ingenuity in design.

Students get global exposure to enrich their learning with universal design concepts and strategies. They have traveled to Dubai and Singapore and visited Indian cities with remarkable architecture, such as Varanasi, Dharamshala, Pondicherry, and Mahabalipuram.

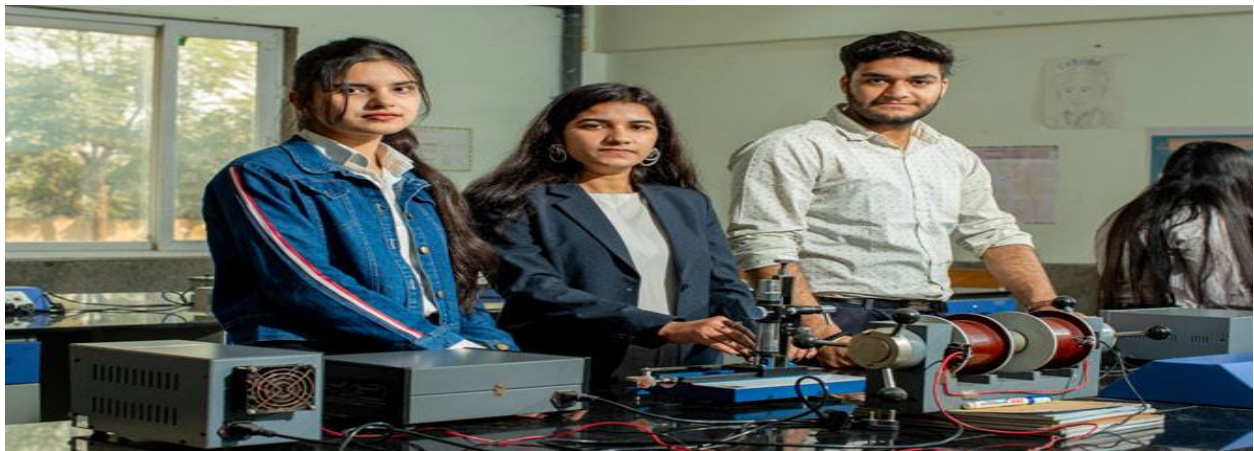

## Workshop on Advertising Campaign



The School of Journalism and Mass Communication, K.R Mangalam University organized a workshop on advertising on 26 February 2019. The workshop was conducted by Ms. Ritu Singh, advertising professional having more than two decades of experience in crafting ads. She has worked with JWT and Times Internet Limited.

Ms. Ritu Singh educated the students about how brands invest considerable energy in choosing the right endorsement strategy keeping in mind the target audience and what advertising strategies they use to enhance the relationship between the consumer, brand and celebrity was more intimate and attracted the right quotient of curiosity in the product. Brand mascots are visually distinct and often

convey the brand message through an amusing story which enhances the recall of the product and how these mascots become so popular in certain cases that they escalate the brand name into day to day conversation. She briefed the students about case studies of significant brands like Amul, Indian airways and Vodafone. She cited examples of popular mascots used in advertising. Adding satire and her quirky take on everything unfolding around since 1966, the 'Amul Girl' has stood the test of time with her sometimes controversial one-liners. The Amul Girl advertising have often been described as one of the best Indian advertising concepts. ## SJMC organised lecture on 'Emerging Trends in Print Journalism'

School of Journalism and Mass Communication organised a guest lecture by Vibhor Sharma, Deputy Editor, Dainik Bhaskar on 20 November, 2018. All the students of BA(JMC) interacted with an established professional in the field of print media. In order to help the students learn and practice law beyond the syllabus taught in the classrooms, the legal aids society was formed by the Department of Law and Management, which is operative at the university. Since its establishment, the society has focused on fostering creativity, awareness and interests across legal and managerial fields. It has spread awareness about numerous legal and management concepts via the conduction of workshops, webinars and guest lectures. During 2018-19, the Society has worked extensively and conducted various events related to different dimensions. These includes awareness on traffic rules and road safety, financial awareness camps etc. In association with the Internal Complaints Committee (KRMU) and District Legal Services Authority, Gurugram, a guest lecture was organised by the Legal Aids Society on the topic “Living in the Shadows: A Project for Acid Attack Victims”.
