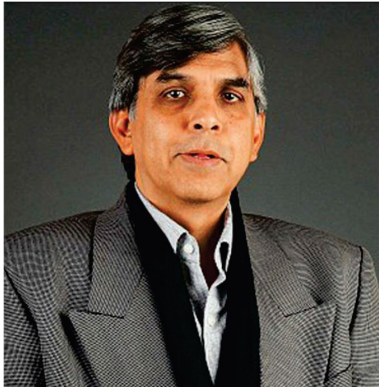

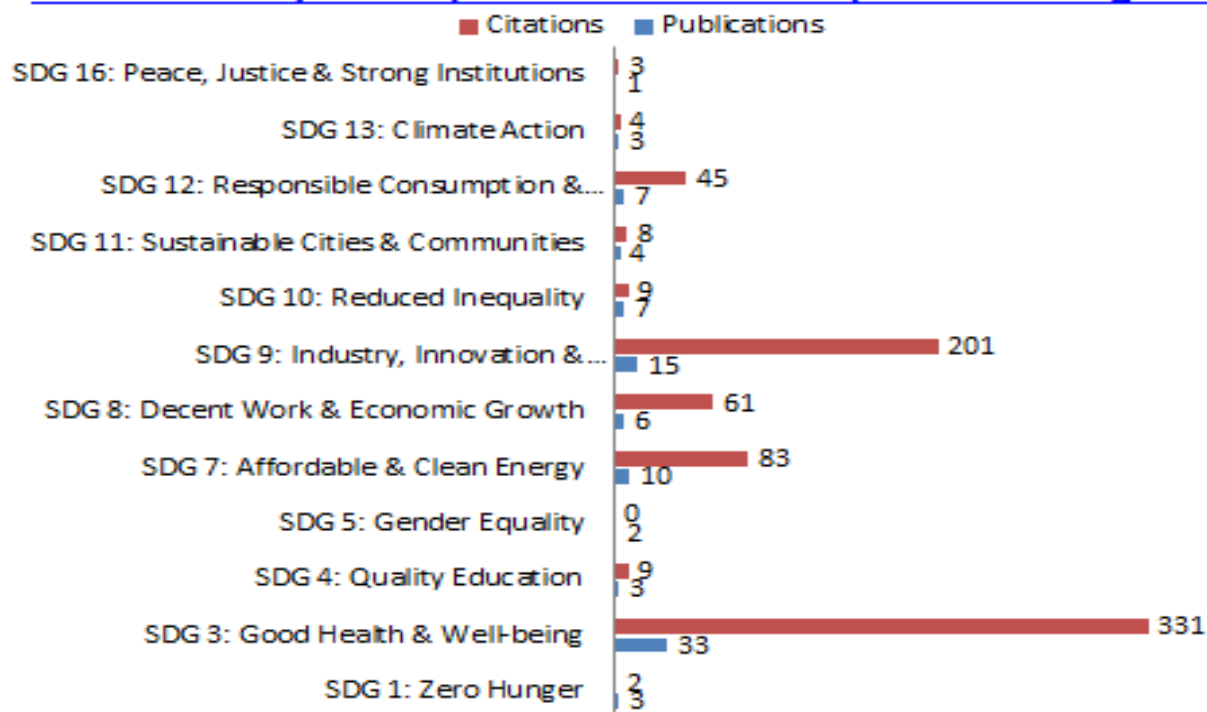
## RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT CELL

### To report the IQAC initiatives for the academic session 2021-22

For Academic Calendar 2021-22 a lot of policies, academic and non-academic activities, research activities and co-curricular activities were closely monitored. Various initiatives were taken at central and school level to enhance the teaching-learning environment in the university. This report gives a glimpse of various activities undertaken by the IQAC cell.

### Curricular Aspects

1. The institute has made a transition from input-based education to **outcome-based education**. The contents beyond syllabus are identified as gap areas in the curriculum through the method of reverse engineering.
2. **Feedback** on curriculum, Governance and other academic and administrative processes has been received from different stakeholders' including students, teachers, employers, parents, and alumni. Based on the feedback, analysis report has been prepared and put before IQAC for further necessary actions.
3. Schools were motivated to engage students in activities which focus on **experiential and participatory learning through practical, mini projects, field projects** etc.
4. Schools were asked to organise activities related to **capacity development** of the students like **Group Discussions, Debates, Declamations, presentation** etc. Furthermore, these activities will enhance team work, confidence, coordination, and cooperation amongst students.
5. To increase the **employability** quotient and equip the students with essential skills to succeed in life several courses have been introduced in pool of **Value-added courses**.
6. To align with the vision of NEP the curriculum was designed to foster the **skill development**.
7. To promote the **interdisciplinary approach** schools were advised to include **open elective courses** in their curriculum.
8. To develop professional learning and preparing students to work in diversified work culture it was decided to have **Internship** as compulsory course in every program.

9. With the aim to facilitate the pace of learning process of students and ensure that quality of teaching is not compromised schools were asked to include the **MOOC- SWAYAM** courses in their curriculum.

1. Development of processes for **Identification of Slow and Fast learners** and maintaining their Record
2. The **Mentor Mentee relationship** is a professional and interpersonal relationship that ensures students are groomed both personally and professionally. Schools were advised to ensure that much meetings are held regularly.
3. **Student-centric methodologies** which include participative learning, experiential learning, collaborative learning and self-learning modes were conducted regularly in each school.

### **Research Innovation and Extension Activities**

1. With a clear focus on a particular area of research the **two centres for excellence** in area of Artificial Intelligence and Sustainable Goal were established in School of Engineering & Technology and School of Legal Studies respectively.
2. To encourage the culture of research and innovation university announced **faculty research incentive policy, awards and sanction of seed grants** to faculty.
3. To abreast with the latest in outside world the schools organised **conferences and workshops**.
4. **IPR Cell** organized various **seminars and workshops on IPR**.
5. To promote innovation and entrepreneurship amongst students **K.R. Mangalam University Entrepreneurship and Innovation Cell (KEIC)** was established to promote innovation and entrepreneurship amongst students. KEIC has conducted 9 events (Jan 22 to July 22); KEIC is registered under Institute's Innovation Council (Ministry of Education) in June,2022; 5 Letter of intent have been given to the students for pre-incubated start-ups. The KEIC has applied for Atal Community Innovation Center on 30.08.22
6. **Adoption of five nearby villages** (Berka, Garhi Bazidpur, Lakhuwas, Kharoda and Ghamroj) to organise extension activities in the area of health, education, agriculture, hygiene etc.
7. Organisation of financial and legal aid camps, career counselling, skill development for students

8. Several MOUs were signed to promote academic and research collaboration

### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

In AY 2021-22 a lot of investment has been done on enhancement of Teaching – learning resources and digitalisation of library.

1. 3 Smart Interactive Panels have been purchased for Teaching – learning purpose in addition to 1 LCS (Lecture Capturing System).
2. For digitalisation of library, library management software –KOHA is under purchase. To enhance digital section of the library, 25 computers have been purchased. The purchase of online library software – REFREAD is also under proposal.
3. The sports facilities have been enhanced by creation of separate chambers for various indoor sports such as chamber with 2 pool tables, chamber with 4 tables for playing table tennis, chamber for playing Foosball (4), separate chambers for playing Chess (4) and Carom Board (4). Dance studio and music studio have been developed.
4. Additional Canteen for students was developed
5. In order of enhance facilities for e-content development, the Creative Cloud All Apps software for Audio Video Mixing is under purchase.

## **Student Support and Progression**

1. As a part of imparting training to students on career and capacity development, Training Cell conducted regular classes with SOMC, SOED, SOHS, SOET, SBAS, SOAS, SJMC, SOLS, and SOAD.
2. SOED conducted the classes for competitive exams. From the next session onwards, a centralized scheme will be proposed where all the schools will be conducting classes for the competitive exams.
3. During AY 2021-22, there were 83 cultural and sports events conducted by different clubs, societies and schools.
4. 43 cultural events during one-week Vasant Vibe from 21 to 25 February 2022 were organized
5. The university organized its Annual Cultural Fest Rendezvous 2022 on 25th February 2022.
6. Annual Inter-University Sports Competition on 11<sup>th</sup> March and 12<sup>th</sup> March 2022. 210 participants from 13 Universities/Institutes took part in the event.
7. Above 100 students secured positions in various inter-university competitions. Students were also sent to other university for participation in cultural and sports events.
8. Alumni Meet was conducted on 12 March 2022 and Alumni Connect Programmes in various schools were organized.
9. Induction and Orientation Program (Deeksharambh) for new students was organized from August 27- September 2, 2022). This 5-days programme covered a number of different aspects like socializing, associating, governing and experiencing. It included the following activities:  
1. Physical Activity; 2. Mentoring; 3. Familiarization to School/Department; 4. Creative Arts and Culture; 5. Literary Activities; 6. Lectures by Eminent People; 7. Visits to Local Area; 8. Co-Curricular Activities.
10. Installed sanitary napkin vending machine at A Block, B Block and Hostel.

- The university has separate air-conditioned hostels for boys and girls.
- The hostel has its own cafeteria that serves all meals.
- The hostel has 24x7 Wi-Fi facility.
- On line laundry facility within hostel.
- Hostel has indoor and outdoor games.
- Hostel students have library access post university hours as well.
- Hostel has a three-tier strong security system, enabled through CCTV cameras, and security staff at all time.

## IT INFRASTRUCTURE

KR Mangalam University has well developed IT facilities including Wi-Fi. Adequate number of computers with printers, scanners and high-speed internet are available in office, examination section, computer room, store and library. This includes extensive computer provision with all the computers in LAN with Internet facility. KRMU has focused consistently deployed best-in-class IT infrastructure and Applications development for Academic and Research support. Over 500+ LAN points are augmented across the campus computer labs and office spaces. The campus backbone network is of 120 Mbps, and Wi-Fi Network points over 75 numbers were deployed across the campus in all academic blocks and hostels blocks for 24X7 internet service, enabling students and faculty to stay connected and access the academic content, anywhere and everywhere in the campus. A Cloud Online Data centre is built to manage network operations efficiently and host all the servers with a continuous power supply so that the network and servers are monitored and are available for better connectivity across all teaching blocks. Server infrastructure includes high power computing nodes, IBM Rack Server with Cloud Base Storage. The enterprise Firewall CISCO has been deployed for handling enhanced load on network and applications, catering to academic and administrative processes, thereby providing a secure campus network. Additional ICT tools such as ZOOM and MS Teams for connecting online with students, faculty members, foreign universities and various other institutions in the country, have also been deployed. Microsoft Outlook, in a hosted environment, is provided to ensure email service for students, faculty and staff, to manage all the communication. Over 2000 Online Outlook mailboxes are hosted in the email solution. 350 desktops and 20 iMac are installed in computer labs, administrative offices and faculty work stations across the campus, giving computing facility to students and faculty for hands-on practical hands-on sessions. Business processes – Academic (Admissions, Academics to Examination), Back office (Fee collection, Hostel booking, Transport booking, with integrated online payment gateways, Staff recruitment, attendance and leaves management, payroll, etc) are done on UNISOFT.

All the students are provided access to Internet resources from various academic buildings and hostels on 24x7 basis. Students can login to their account for any kind of information and download from ERP and University's Website. The portal also caters to various needs of the researchers, faculty, Parents of the students and the staff of the University. With this system, learning and monitoring becomes easier and efficient. Most importantly, student-student and staff-student communication are greatly facilitated by this technology.

## SPORTS

The Sports Society at our university is dedicated to promoting physical fitness and sportsmanship. Throughout the year, they've organized a variety of sporting events and activities aimed at encouraging an active and healthy lifestyle. They hosted "ZEST," a sports event that brought together students to compete in various athletic disciplines, promoting camaraderie and competition. These initiatives emphasize the importance of physical fitness and provide students with opportunities to showcase their sporting talents.
