
Introduction


Content

To encourage students creativity and confidence.



Sonna Road, Gurugram, (Haryana) Participants as well as audience members enjoyed the event and helped the participants to promote their creations.




'Dance is our pulse, our heartbeat, our breathing; it's the rhythm of our life' When we try to translate the vitality of our life energy into fluid moves, we dance.





Introduction



- 3. Confidence boost up and practical ,social and educational skills also develops


Conclusion






Picture 2: Participants showing skills in the Mandala Art





- 4. The students develop culinary skills that they can use later in life.





Introduction


K.R. Mangalam University organised an Inter-University Nukkad Natak Competition in the campus on 24th February 2022. The two teams participated in the Competition. The Marital Rape was chosen as the theme of the Competition. The Teams prepared themselves to showcase a Natak to spread the awareness as well as to improve the mind-set of the Young and up-coming generation.

Objectives

- To increase the participatory approach for upliftment of society among the students
- To improve the mind-sets of the society towards the woman and her liberty importance.
- To promote proper awareness and delivered relevant information.
- To provide student with a platform in order to showcase their talent with key ideology to spread the awareness on the various social, culture and economic issues.

Content

Two teams participated in the competition. Team-1 was co-ordinated by Mansi Gautam, student of School of Legal Studies. There were 10 members in the team and their aim was to

make everyone aware about the concept of "Marital Rape" and at the same time to address the need for specific legal provisions for the same.

Every 'State' and a country defines 'marital rape' differently but popularly, marital rape is defined as an unwanted intercourse or penetration (oral; anal or vaginal) obtained by force or threat of force or when wife/either spouse is unable to give consent. The "lack of consent" is an essential element and need not involve physical violence. Marital rape is considered as a form of domestic violence and sexual abuse but so far in India, marital rape is not recognized as a kind of rape under the provisions of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 and recognizes marital rape as an offence only when committed with the wife who is under eighteen years of age.

Although historically, sexual intercourse within the bond of marriage was regarded as a right of spouses, but engaging in the act without a spouse's consent is now widely classified as rape by many societies around the world, repudiated by international conventions, and is increasingly being criminalized. Marital rape is more widely experienced by women, though not exclusively.

This nukkad natak portrayed the numerous ways in which many women are harassed, demeaned and suppressed not only by the society but also by her own family and thereby this show also addressed the necessity of raising voices to address the need for specific legislation recognizing 'marital rape' as an offence under the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

Team 2 was co-ordinated by Nupur Jaiswal, student of School of Legal Studies and 9 students participated as the members of this team. The topic of this drama was "Pseudo Feminism" which a popular concept these days.

Pseudo-Feminism is basically the misinterpretation of word 'feminism'. While the latter aims at achieving equality for women, the former can be called as 'feminism of convenience'. The term 'pseudo-feminism' simply suggests that the women deserve more respect than men and at the same time the concept indicates over empowerment of women and suppression of men discarding fairness and equality.

The natak presented by Team 2 pictured the instances wherein the misconceived concept of feminism i.e., 'pseudo-feminism' targeted an innocent man, who was made to be beaten by

the public without having regards to the legal discourse and the instance led to the violation of his right to lead a dignified life.




Teaching aids play an important role for effective classroom teaching and learning. The following guidelines were followed during the competition:

Activity Outcome






Photo 1: Participants explain the teaching aid prepared to the Judges.





Photo 3: An array of diverse and vibrant low-cost teaching aids prepared by participants.






OBJECTIVE






Figure 1: JUDGES WERE DISCUSSING





Activity Outcome






Introduction


Content



- Band teams got and idea of improvement or gaps in their performance.


Conclusion



Objectives


- To encourage students to develop their acting skills in terms of body language (posture, movements, gestures, etc.

She introduced students to the current and relevant topics to speak about.


Objectives





Content








Following were the activities in which the students participated;



Hasta La Vista'21


