




## UNIVERSITY HOSTELS

In the academic year 2024–25, K.R. Mangalam University Hostel housed 605 vibrant and aspiring students from various parts of the country. The hostel administration was efficiently overseen by Dr. Kaushal Kumar, Mr. Naveen Kumar, and Ms. Sukriti Chauhan, who served as the vital link between the students and the administration. Day-to-day decisions were taken in consultation with them, ensuring participatory and student-centric governance.

Student representatives were elected to assist in hostel management. Mr. Ankit Mahla and Ms. Payal served commendably as the University Sports Coordinator and Hostel Coordinator, respectively.





## **Committees and Student Leadership**

To promote leadership, inclusivity, and participatory functioning, several student committees were formed, including Cultural, Sports, Mess, Discipline, and Cleanliness Committees, with balanced representation from both genders and minority groups. These committees enabled students to grow into responsible leaders and team players.

### **Cultural Committee**

### **Following initiatives were undertaken by IQAC:**

#### **1. Workshop On Outcome-Based Education (OBE)**

KRMU-IQAC organized a pivotal training programme on Outcome-Based Education (OBE) aimed at elevating educational practices and outcomes across all its schools. The initiative, which started 2 July 2024 to 24 July 2024, was designed to provide faculty members with an in-depth understanding of OBE principles and practical implementation strategies. This training, conducted under the expert guidance of Prof. Raghuvir Singh, Vice Chancellor of KRMU, was structured to address a range of critical aspects of OBE and its application within an academic context.

The training programme was led by Prof. Raghuvir Singh, whose extensive knowledge and experience in educational leadership and quality assurance greatly contributed to the success of the workshop. Prof. Singh's leadership provided valuable insights into the principles of OBE, focusing

on how educational outcomes can be effectively achieved and measured. His expertise was instrumental in guiding the faculty through the nuances of OBE and helping them understand how to apply these principles in their own teaching practices.

The workshop covered several essential topics. Initially, it introduced OBE as an educational philosophy centered around achieving predetermined learning outcomes or goals. This approach contrasts with Input-Based Education (IBE), which emphasizes content delivery and memory-based assessments. OBE shifts the focus to what students are expected to achieve by the end of their educational journey, making education more student-centered and outcome-oriented. Prof. Raghuvir Singh elaborated on how this shift could enhance student engagement and foster continuous improvement. A significant portion of the workshop was dedicated to aligning educational processes with OBE. Faculty members learned how to identify stakeholder expectations, formulate Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs), Program Outcomes (POs), and Course Outcomes (COs).

The OBE training programme organized by KRMU-IQAC marked a significant step towards enhancing the quality and effectiveness of education at the university. By providing a structured approach to understanding and implementing OBE, the programme fostered a more student-centered, outcome-driven educational environment. Prof. Raghuvir Singh's expertise and leadership played a crucial role in guiding faculty members through the complexities of OBE, ensuring that they were well-prepared to apply these principles in their teaching and assessment practices. The phased approach of the training ensured that all faculty members received comprehensive and targeted instruction, contributing to the continuous improvement of educational practices across KRMU.

- Team Bonding Session: Strengthening relationships among faculty through interactive team-building exercises.

## **3. Intensive Teaching Workshop**

An “Intensive Teaching workshop” was organized from 15<sup>th</sup> July 2024 to 30<sup>th</sup> July 2024 by Office of Academic Affairs in collaboration with IQAC for all faculties of K R Mangalam University to refine their pedagogical skills and foster a stimulating learning environment. The workshop focused on innovative teaching methodologies, effective communication strategies, and assessment techniques.

Success in academic publishing requires identifying high-impact journals by considering impact factor, scope, audience, and reputation. Strong academic writing—clear, structured, and persuasive—is vital for engaging a scholarly audience. A concise, compelling abstract and introduction should highlight your research's significance and relevance. Present findings clearly using well-designed tables, figures, and appropriate statistics. Finally, responding effectively to reviewer comments and revising accordingly boosts the likelihood of acceptance. The workshop was carefully curated to cater to early-career researchers, Ph.D. students, postdoctoral scholars, and even seasoned researchers who were looking to enhance their publication strategies. It combined theoretical discussions with practical applications, enabling attendees to leave the event not only with new knowledge but also with actionable steps they could take toward improving their academic writing and publishing strategies.

## **2nd International Conference on Advanced Materials for Green Chemistry and Sustainable Environment under the aegis IQAC**





The **Centre of Excellence for Advanced Materials Research (CEAMR)** at *K. R. Mangalam University* is one of the key research hubs established to support cutting-edge studies in **materials science and engineering applications** as part of the university's broader research ecosystem. It contributes to interdisciplinary research goals that address technological challenges in materials development, characterization, and sustainability.

**Research Focus:** The Centre supports advanced materials research, collaborating internally with other schools and across disciplines to advance innovation in areas such as sustainable materials, functional materials, and applications that align with global scientific trends.

**Integration with Broader Research:** CEAMR operates alongside other research units including the Centre of Excellence in Artificial Intelligence and the SDG Centre, contributing to the university's overall research objectives promoting interdisciplinary scholarship and real-world problem-solving.

**Conferences and Scholarly Events:** Researchers associated with advanced materials at KRMU actively participate in and organize international conferences (e.g., *Advanced Materials for Green Chemistry and Sustainable Environment*) that foster academic discussion and global collaborations, enhancing the visibility and impact of material science research.

**Research Output & Environment:** The university reports strong research activity overall — with thousands of publications, patents, and significant grants in scientific and engineering domains — indicating a supportive ecosystem for CEAMR's work.

## Centre of Excellence in Artificial Intelligence (CoE-AI)

The academic year 2024–2025 was a highly productive and impactful period for the Centre of Excellence in Artificial Intelligence (CoE-AI) at K. R. Mangalam University. Throughout the year, the Centre demonstrated significant progress in its mission of fostering innovation, skill development, research culture, and industry collaboration in emerging technologies. With Artificial Intelligence rapidly transforming industries and academic disciplines worldwide, CoE-AI played a pivotal role in empowering students and faculty to engage with these technological shifts through hands-on learning, competitions, academic events, and collaborative platforms.

From the outset of the year, the leadership set a clear vision of positioning the Centre as a space where interdisciplinary learning, societal relevance, and technological advancement merge. The Vice-Chancellor acknowledged the Centre's progress in organizing landmark hackathons, training programs, and conferences, noting how AI is no longer viewed merely as a technological advancement but as a tool for reshaping education, professional practices, and community development. This leadership support was complemented by the Chairperson's emphasis on strengthening partnerships, promoting research, and fostering student engagement across AI, Machine Learning, Data Science, Cybersecurity, Natural Language Processing, and related fields.

### Skill Development and Hackathon Culture

One of the strongest areas of growth during the year was the Centre's focus on competitive and experiential learning. Multiple hackathons were organized to help students apply theoretical concepts to real-world problems. Events such as **Geekathon 2024** and **Hack KRMU 4.0** attracted significant participation from both within the university and from external institutions across India. Hack KRMU 4.0 alone witnessed over a thousand participants and created an energetic ecosystem combining coding marathons, expert mentorship, workshops, peer learning, and project demonstrations. These platforms challenged students to innovate using AI, IoT, AR/VR, Web3, and data-driven solutions, and provided valuable exposure to technical workflows, product development, and entrepreneurship pathways.

Similarly, the one-day **Deep Data Hack**, **Kaggle Competition**, and **Hack4Kaggle 1.0** further strengthened student familiarity with data science and competitive model-building environments. Students engaged in real datasets, evaluated model performance, optimized algorithms, and presented outcomes under time-bound pressures—simulating industry-like problem-solving environments. These experiences not only helped students develop confidence, but also encouraged ongoing project work, research publications, and participation in national hackathon circuits, where CoE-AI students consistently performed well.

## **Faculty Development and Academic Capacity Building**

In addition to student initiatives, the Centre also emphasized faculty capacity building. The **Faculty Development Program (FDP)** organized in collaboration with **E&ICT Academy, IIT Guwahati** was one of the major academic highlights of the year. The FDP bridged cybersecurity with AI/ML frameworks, offering faculty hands-on training in threat detection, supervised and unsupervised learning, neural network modeling, and ethical considerations in deployment. Such programs strengthen curricular relevance and ensure faculty remain updated on current industry requirements and research methodologies.

The Centre also introduced the **Winter Training Program in AI and ML**, designed for both internal and external students. The training offered structured modules in machine learning workflows, neural networks, Generative AI tools, and model evaluation techniques using TensorFlow and Orange Data Mining tools. Through these initiatives, the Centre succeeded in developing fundamental and advanced skill layers across multiple learner groups.

## **Peer-Led Learning and Student Leadership**

A notable innovation during the year was the launch of the **TechSphere peer-tutoring initiative**, based on the principle of “By the Students, For the Students.” This initiative empowered technically proficient students to lead workshops on skills such as prompt engineering, Next.js development, Kaggle modeling, React Native app development, and data visualization techniques. The model encouraged leadership, communication skills, and technical confidence, while promoting collaborative learning and mentorship. Students responded enthusiastically, demonstrating that peer models can effectively complement formal classroom instruction.

## **Industry Exposure and Collaborations**

Strengthening industry linkages was another priority area. An industrial visit to **CDAC Noida** provided students with real exposure to national-level R&D work in high-performance computing, AI, and cybersecurity. During the visit, a **Letter of Association (LoA)** was signed between the university and CDAC, laying the groundwork for joint research, training, and industry-academia programs. Such collaborations bridge the gap between theoretical academic learning and evolving industry expectations, helping students understand the competitive standards of the AI workforce.

## **Conferences, Research, and Publications**

The Centre also played a major role in academic dissemination through conferences. The **2nd International Conference on Multidisciplinary Research and Innovations in Engineering (MRIE-2025)** and the **National IESS 2025 Conference** provided platforms for scholars,

researchers, and industry experts to present work, network, and engage across topics such as AI, cybersecurity, smart systems, blockchain, human-centered computing, and sustainability. These conferences boosted visibility and reinforced the Centre's role in encouraging intellectual and research exchanges at both national and international levels.

On the publication front, the Centre released a **four-volume edited book series on Artificial Intelligence**, bringing together diverse research contributions across AI domains. Students and faculty also published research papers and received Best Paper recognitions at reputed academic forums. These outputs provided evidence of growing research culture, knowledge-building, and academic rigor within the university.

### **Student Achievements and Recognition**

Student teams from CoE-AI performed notably well in external hackathons and competitions at NIT Hamirpur, NIT Kurukshetra, Galgotias, IILM University, and other institutions. Multiple awards, cash prizes, and ambassador roles reflected growing student competitiveness and visibility within national technological circles. These achievements strengthened the Centre's reputation and demonstrated tangible outcomes of its training and mentorship ecosystem.

Overall, the 2024–2025 academic year showcased the Centre of Excellence in Artificial Intelligence as a vibrant hub of innovation, collaboration, and emerging technology exposure. Through hackathons, conferences, training programs, peer initiatives, research outputs, and industry partnerships, the Centre effectively nurtured a future-ready ecosystem that supports students and faculty in becoming contributors to the evolving AI landscape.





## Centre of Excellence for Sustainable Development Goals

The academic year 2024–2025 was a year of meaningful action, growth, and transformation for the Centre of Excellence for Sustainable Development Goals (CoE-SDG) at K. R. Mangalam University. Established with the aim of integrating sustainability into the university's academic, environmental, and social ecosystem, the Centre actively promoted awareness, research, and practical implementation of SDG-aligned initiatives across the campus. Through its activities, the Centre positioned sustainability not as an abstract concept, but as a lived practice embedded in campus culture, academic programs, student engagement, and institutional planning.

From the beginning of the year, the Centre remained committed to enhancing environmental consciousness and adopting green practices that directly contribute to global Sustainable Development Goals, particularly in areas such as climate action, clean energy, responsible consumption, and partnerships for sustainable development. Many of these initiatives were designed not only to cultivate environmental responsibility within the campus, but also to serve as replicable models for sustainable institutional practices beyond academic boundaries.

### Sustainable Campus Development and Green Infrastructure

One of the Centre's key focus areas during the year was the advancement of an eco-friendly and resource-efficient campus. The university continued to expand renewable energy adoption through solar infrastructure, with **984 installed solar panels generating approximately 41,850 units per month**, contributing significantly to clean energy transition and reduced dependency on non-renewable sources. The campus also implemented energy conservation systems such as **LED lighting, sensor-based operations for washrooms and entry gates**, and power-efficient equipment. These measures demonstrated the university's commitment to energy responsibility while providing practical exposure to students studying sustainability-related fields.

Waste reduction and circularity were also prioritized through initiatives like **paper recycling, digital media substitution for printed materials, in-house nurseries, greenhouses, and organic orchards**. Transportation-related carbon reduction was supported through **centralized CNG bus fleets and carpooling encouragement**, promoting responsible mobility practices and reducing emissions. Collectively, these initiatives strengthened the campus identity as a green, environmentally conscious environment that nurtures sustainable habits through everyday infrastructure.

Tree plantation efforts continued throughout the year, expanding biodiversity across the campus and involving students directly in collective environmental stewardship. An interesting addition was the

**QR coding of trees**, allowing digital tracking, transparency, and learning opportunities for students interested in botany, ecology, and environmental technology.

### **Academic Integration and SDG-aligned Curricula**

Beyond infrastructure, the Centre emphasized academic integration of sustainability through coursework, field experiences, and research. Sustainable practice initiatives were incorporated across multiple schools in the university, each contributing through context-specific implementations.

The **School of Agricultural Sciences** promoted natural farming methodologies including organic cultivation, mushroom production, poly-house cultivation, and pesticide-free farming methods. These practices ensured that agriculture students engaged deeply with SDG frameworks related to soil health, food security, and sustainable resource management.

The **School of Medical & Allied Sciences** strengthened chemical hazard literacy by offering a university-level elective course on chemical hazards and conducting trainings on chemical handling and safety, contributing toward responsible consumption and environmental health.

The **School of Education** collaborated with social and environmental NGOs such as **Save Aravali Trust**, enabling students to participate in field projects focused on biodiversity conservation and ecological protection in the Aravali range—one of India's oldest and ecologically threatened mountain systems. Students working directly within these ecosystems developed firsthand awareness of conservation challenges and human–environment interactions.

The **School of Architecture & Design** introduced innovative green infrastructure such as vertical green walls inside academic buildings, demonstrating how architectural design can enhance microclimates, improve air quality, and cultivate aesthetic sustainability in built spaces.

Other departments also played active roles: the **School of Science & Applied Sciences** hosted sustainability research events, published scholarly work on materials and green chemistry, and offered minors in environmental studies; the **School of Management & Commerce** conducted creative assignments promoting concepts like sustainable packaging, waste-to-product entrepreneurship, and green marketing practices.

### **Research, Publications, and Conferences**

The Centre also recognized research as a critical pillar of advancing sustainability. A major achievement during the year was the significant growth in SDG-aligned publications by university faculty and students, as indexed in external databases such as SCOPUS. The university also published

**17 books related to Sustainable Development Goals**, reflecting the growing intellectual depth and commitment to global development discourse.

Multiple international and national conferences focusing on sustainability themes were organized across different schools. These included forums on sustainable business transformation, environmentally conscious design, green materials, Indian knowledge systems, sustainable entrepreneurship, and healthcare innovation. These conferences attracted academicians, researchers, policymakers, and industry practitioners, providing rich platforms for knowledge exchange and interdisciplinary dialogue. Many conferences featured keynote speakers, abstract books, workshops, paper presentations, awards, and cultural programs, strengthening both academic rigor and student engagement.

### **Outcomes, Impact, and Recognition**

The Centre's initiatives resulted in notable outcomes, both quantitatively and qualitatively. Key outcomes included:

1. Increased adoption of renewable energy and reduction in carbon emissions.
2. Enhanced student participation in sustainability projects and field activities.
3. Strong research output contributing to SDG-oriented academic literature.
4. Expansion of sustainability-focused curriculum across disciplines.
5. Growth in institutional collaborations and partnerships.
6. Recognition through awards, conferences, and publications.
7. Increased awareness and behavioural changes among students and staff.

Carbon footprint calculations conducted during the year provided a scientific basis for monitoring emission trends and guided future planning for campus decarbonization efforts.

The year concluded with the Centre of Excellence for SDG successfully strengthening sustainability as an identity marker of K. R. Mangalam University. Through infrastructure upgrades, academic integration, field outreach, research contributions, and cultural awareness, the Centre continued to build a community that is informed, responsible, and committed to shaping a sustainable future.





## **KEIC Foundation**

The academic year 2024–2025 marked an important phase of growth, innovation, and entrepreneurial advancement for the K.R. Mangalam University Entrepreneurship and Incubation Centre Foundation (KEIC Foundation). Built on the vision of nurturing a vibrant startup culture within the university ecosystem, the centre continued to strengthen its support mechanisms for student founders, innovators, and young entrepreneurs through incubation facilities, mentorship, skill-building programs, partnerships, and active participation in national innovation platforms.

At the heart of KEIC Foundation lies the belief that universities are not just learning spaces, but also launchpads for young entrepreneurs. Throughout the year, the centre worked to transform ideas into prototypes and prototypes into real ventures, ensuring that students not only acquire academic knowledge but develop the confidence, risk-taking mindset, and competencies needed to participate in India's growing innovation and startup landscape.

### **Institutional Vision and Ecosystem Growth**

The KEIC Foundation envisions becoming a dynamic hub for innovation and entrepreneurship that empowers students, faculty, and community members to ideate, experiment, innovate, and commercialize solutions that create positive societal impact. This year, the centre continued to build an ecosystem that supports interdisciplinary collaborations and encourages bold experimentation. The institutional startup policy (KRMU Innovation & Startup Policy – KRMUISP), formulated in line with the National Innovation and Startup Policy, played a pivotal role in guiding incubation activities, participation standards, and support processes.

The journey of KEIC over the past year narrated a story of expanding opportunities, deepening partnerships, and rising student participation. The number of startups supported by the centre increased significantly — from 28 in the previous academic year to 48 startups this year — reflecting growing entrepreneurial confidence and institutional support structures. The centre also strengthened external linkages with organizations such as IIT Delhi, AIC, DST, MSME, STPI, Electroporate Park Bhubaneswar, and the GCEC Global Foundation. These partnerships enabled wider exposure, mentoring access, and resource availability for university startups.

### **Leadership and Operational Framework**

A team of committed key functionaries guided the activities of the centre. The President provided strategic vision and institutional leadership, steering the mission of innovation across the university. The Vice President actively supported collaboration and outreach initiatives, while the Convenor ensured operational execution and day-to-day functioning. Coordinators from multiple disciplines

contributed to organizing events, bootcamps, competitions, and awareness programs. This interdisciplinary leadership model strengthened the ecosystem and ensured that entrepreneurship was not confined to a single school or field but emerged as a cross-campus movement.

### **Infrastructure and Facilities for Pre-Incubation and Incubation**

During the year, KEIC continued to expand its pre-incubation and incubation facilities that support idea generation, prototyping, and venture development. The establishment of the **Design Thinking Lab** was a major milestone. Equipped with 3D printers, laser cutting tools, robotics kits, IoT components, and relevant knowledge resources, the lab enabled students to convert theoretical ideas into tangible prototypes.

Beyond physical facilities, the centre amplified intellectual support through mentoring, ideation programs, boot camps, and legal/IPR awareness sessions. This combination of structured thought processes and fabrication capability helped bridge the gap between conceptualization and implementation — a crucial step for early-stage founders.

### **Activities, Events, and Entrepreneurial Training**

The academic year saw a dynamic calendar of activities that facilitated learning-by-doing. The KEIC Foundation conducted **approximately 75 activities**, including hackathons, intellectual property rights workshops, investor awareness sessions, innovation bootcamps, exposure visits, and celebration events under the Ministry of Education's Innovation Cell.

These initiatives demonstrated visible outcomes:

- 1. Ideas generated:** 28
- 2. Prototypes developed:** 14
- 3. Startups/Ventures established:** 15
- 4. Funds spent on awareness & promotion:** ₹22,00,500
- 5. Financial support provided to innovators/startups:** ₹3,25,000

The substantial financial investment towards awareness and infrastructure highlighted the university's commitment to long-term ecosystem development rather than one-time events.

### **Achievements, Recognition, and Grants**

The year also brought several recognitions for KEIC and its innovators. The Foundation was awarded a **3-star ranking in 2024 by the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), Ministry of Education**, validating its continuous efforts in incubation and innovation promotion.





## OFFICE OF THE DEAN ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

In academic year 2023-24, K.R. Mangalam University adopted the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 to transform undergraduate education into a more holistic and multidisciplinary experience. The university's approach follows a phase-wise implementation plan, aiming to introduce a flexible, skill-oriented, and student-centric curriculum aligned with the demands of 21st-century education. During the 2023-24 academic year, the initial phase of NEP 2020 was rolled out across 23 programs, incorporating curriculum restructuring. Additionally, 26 Open Electives and 28 Value- Added Courses and 10 streams of minors were introduced to promote interdisciplinary education. Courses and projects focusing on AI, machine learning, and data analytics were actively encouraged. Significant emphasis was placed on digital resources and the KRMU Learning Management System (KRMU-LMS) powered by MOODLE to support seamless hybrid learning experiences. The KRMU-LMS facilitates the exchange of diverse content through in-house video-recorded lectures, Open Educational Resources (OERs), and electronic self-learning materials, including PowerPoint presentations, PDFs, Word documents, and external links. The KRMU-LMS is accessible to both students and faculty members using their Microsoft Outlook credentials. Additionally, a user-friendly mobile application (Moodle App) allows students to conveniently access educational materials on the go.

## **Action Taken Report on Implementation of NEP-2020 at K.R. Mangalam University**

K.R. Mangalam University has adopted the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 to transform undergraduate education into a more holistic and multidisciplinary experience. The university's approach is structured across phase-wise implementation, aiming to bring a flexible, skill-oriented, and student-centric curriculum aligned with 21st-century educational demands.

### **Actions Undertaken by K.R. Mangalam University**

#### **Phase I:**

1. **Constitution of Committee for Implementation of NEP-2020** (February 9, 2023)
  - A dedicated committee was established to oversee NEP-2020 implementation and ensure continuous compliance with its objectives (Annexure-I).
2. **NEP Awareness Programs for Faculty** (January 28, 2023)
  - Conducted an awareness program for faculty, emphasizing the NEP 2020 curriculum structure, the "Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programs," and the concept of a flexible education model with entry and exit points.
3. **Development and Presentation of Implementation Guidelines** (March 27, 2023)
  - Prepared a comprehensive set of guidelines tailored to implementing NEP-2020 at the university and shared them with relevant faculty and administrative departments (Annexure-II).
4. **Implementation in 23 Programs (AY 2023-24)**

The first phase focused on restructuring 23 undergraduate programs to align with NEP-2020 guidelines (Annexure-III, List of Programmes). Key actions included:

➤ **Curriculum Restructuring:** During the 2023-24 academic year, the initial phase of NEP 2020 was rolled out across 23 programs (Annexure-IV, Sample Copy of Programme Study), with curriculum restructuring to incorporate:

- Multiple entry and exit points
- Minors
- Skill enhancement courses
- Interdisciplinary courses as open electives
- Value-added courses
- Ability enhancement courses
- Summer internships

#### **Phase II: Expanded Implementation in 8 Programmes (AY 2024-25)**

Following the initial phase, NEP-2020 reforms were extended to eight programmes (Annexure-V, List of Programmes) with a focus on incorporating traditional knowledge, community involvement, and digital learning. Actions included:

1. **Curriculum Updates with Indian Knowledge System (IKS) Courses**
  - Introduced courses on the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) to foster awareness of indigenous knowledge, heritage, and history among students.

## 2. Extracurricular Activities and Community Service Integration

- Implemented mandatory extracurricular and community service activities, assigning credits to encourage well-rounded development and societal engagement.

## 3. Mandatory MOOCs in the Curriculum

- Integrated Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) as credit-bearing components to promote continuous learning and exposure to global perspectives in various disciplines.

### Phase III: Future Roadmap

The roadmap focuses on broadening the scope of NEP-2020 implementation, enhancing vocational integration, and introducing postgraduate education programmes. Planned actions include:

1. Extension to All Remaining Programmes
2. Broaden our educational approach from interdisciplinary to multidisciplinary learning
3. Introduction of Apprenticeship-Embedded Degree Programmes
4. Development of One-Year Master's Programmes
5. Introduction of Courses on Modern Indian Languages

It brings together students from across institutions to participate in cultural, academic, and competitive activities, fostering camaraderie, creativity, and friendly competition. Edude Fiesta is a platform where students can showcase their talents, network with peers, and celebrate the diversity and energy of campus life. At the heart of our student governance is the **Students' Council**, where representatives hold various posts and act as the voice of the student body. This council plays an instrumental role in collaborating with the DSW Office to address student concerns, plan events, and contribute to decision-making processes that impact student welfare. Through this council, we ensure that every student's voice is heard and valued and that they play an active role in shaping their university experience.

Deeksharambh - STUDENT INDUCTION PROGRAMME organized by Student Welfare in coordination with all schools of K.R. Mangalam University

The transition from school to university is one of the most challenging events in a student's life. When a student enters an institution, he/ she comes with diverse thoughts, backgrounds and

preparations. An induction program helps the students acclimatize to their new roles and environment. The Student Induction Programme is a comprehensive orientation process designed to introduce new students to the university or educational institution, familiarize them with campus life, academic expectations, and support services, and create a sense of belonging within the campus community. This program aimed to ease the transition for incoming students, provide essential information, and help them integrate successfully into the academic and social environment. It is an initiative to make the new students adjust and feel comfortable in the new environment, inculcate in them the ethos and culture of the University, and help them bond with the faculty and other students. This aims to engage the new students as they have come to the University before their regular classes start.

The five-day induction programme has been scheduled keeping in mind the importance of this transition period from school to university life. The sessions have been meticulously designed to ensure students' holistic development, hence preparing them for their successful career. This programme covers a number of different aspects like socializing, associating, governing and experiencing. It includes the following activities:

#### 1. Physical Activity

This involves a daily routine of physical activities with sports and games. These are helpful in developing a sense of team work. Under this, KRMU provides its students numerous indoor and outdoor games. The University organizes regular sports activities and competitions for students and faculty members to enhance their physical and mental health. The students from KRMU also participate in sports events held by other universities/colleges and institution

2. Mentoring- Mentoring takes place in the context and setting of universal human values. It is the most important part which helps students connect with the university, faculty and other students. It gets the student to explore oneself and allows one to experience the joy of learning, stand up to peer pressure, take decisions with courage, be aware of relationships, be sensitive to others, understand the role of money in life, and feel prosperity, etc. Mentoring is a means to connect with the students and most importantly to build relationships between teachers and students which last for their upcoming 3 to 4 years and possibly beyond. For this, a Mentor (Faculty) is allotted to a particular Mentee (Student) for her/his entire stay at the university. This is done with an objective to build and maintain a stronger bond between the two in a longer duration for the

growth of the Mentee. It is done by getting students to explore and think by engaging in dialogue, group discussions and real-life activities. The bond so generated helps the students during tough times in study courses

3. Familiarization to School/Department- Through these sessions the students are familiarized with their schools/departments and programme of their study, labs and other facilities.

4. Creative Arts and Culture- The students are exposed to culture and art forms like painting, sculpture, music, dance etc. which enable them to express themselves creatively. This helps students develop a sense of aesthetics and also enhances creativity which flows into their studies too.

5. Literary Activities- Literary activities encompass opportunities like debating, reading, writing, enacting a play etc. through such activities, the students explore the richness of languages and thereby contributes to it.

6. Lectures by Eminent People- Lectures by eminent people are regularly organized by the schools/departments for their students so that they are given exposure about various facets of their academic as well as professional life. For this, professors, alumni, socially active people, professional experts and industrial experts are invited so that the students can keep themselves updated and informed.

7. Visits to Local Area- The University also takes its students on visits to industries, villages for extension programmes, orphanages, visits etc. which helps them bond with each other on the one hand while on the other hand it also attaches them with the society at large and do some community service

8. Co-Curricular Activities- K. R. Mangalam University continuously works towards developing the students academically and advancing their leadership qualities and interpersonal skills so as to prepare them to play an effective role in society. Besides teaching, the university also provides social, cultural, musical, recreational and sporting facilities to enable each student to realize their academic and personal potential while studying at the university. To provide the students with all the required opportunities and adequate amenities for all round development of personality and leadership, different clubs and societies have been established. These clubs and societies essentially work toward student-centred development. It is a forum, where through the mode of cultural and other such activities, the students meet each other, exchange ideas and develop into good human beings. Through the active engagement of students, fresh talents in stage, literary, art, science etc are identified. The objectives of these clubs and societies are to promote mutual contact, a democratic outlook and a spirit of oneness among students by simultaneously developing their social, cultural

and intellectual aspects. They specifically work towards identifying the general needs of the students and then conduct various co-curricular activities like sports, NSS, cultural, and health-related activities. This facilitates the students to come closer and work together as a team while organizing and conducting big events like freshers' meet, cultural programmes or annual fests etc. Activities organized by different clubs/societies work towards social awareness, social upliftment, environmental conservation and several other initiatives that the faculty and students take up together as a team. Rallies, blood donation camps, awareness drives, plantation drives etc. have helped students to connect with society and adopt an empathetic attitude. The student who enrolls in the University has to select one Club/Society of her/his choice from amongst 16 different clubs and societies operational at K. R. Mangalam University. After getting associated with the club/society of their choice, the students work in coherence with the other team members and towards achieving the goals of the concerned club/society. The student, in this way, gets a platform to showcase her/his talent, plan and organize various events at our own university and can participate in the competitions held at other universities/colleges and institutions.

## Student Council



## CAREER DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

The Career Development Centre (CDC) at K.R. Mangalam University plays a pivotal role in preparing students for life beyond academics by offering placement opportunities, internships, counselling, and guidance for higher education. Under the leadership of Dr. Vibha Thakur, Director, CDC, the year 2024–25 was marked by robust industry participation, significant student achievements, and a strengthened ecosystem of career support. The CDC worked with students across undergraduate and postgraduate programmes, focusing on employability skills, industry readiness, and holistic development.

### Recruiter Engagement and Placements

During 2024–25, KRMU witnessed strong recruiter engagement with **129 companies visiting the campus** across varied sectors, including IT, Law, Pharma, Consulting, Education, Healthcare, Media, Manufacturing, and Retail. 




### Extension and Outreach- Dr Shikha Dutt Sharma and Dr Tania Gupta

#### Social Outreach Activities – 2024–25

During the academic year 2024–25, K.R. Mangalam University organized a wide range of **social outreach programmes** to strengthen its commitment toward community engagement, social responsibility, and holistic student development. These initiatives were carried out through the active involvement of the **National Service Scheme (NSS)**, the **Youth Red Cross Committee (YRC)**, and various academic schools of the university.

The activities spanned diverse themes such as **healthcare, nutrition, gender equality, environment, digital literacy, road safety, and national integration**, directly impacting nearby villages, schools, and communities. More than **1,200 students** participated across these programs, contributing significant volunteer hours and acting as ambassadors of social change.

Some of the key highlights include:

- **Health and Well-Being:** Multiple health check-up camps, blood donation drives, maternal and child welfare programs, and awareness sessions on cancer prevention, tuberculosis, menstrual health, PCOD/PCOS, malaria and dengue prevention were organized. First aid and CPR training sessions empowered students with life-saving skills, while wellness workshops promoted balanced nutrition and mental health.
- **Education and Literacy:** Through initiatives such as Shiksha Uday: A One-Day Literacy Camp, computer literacy programs, English language evaluation in rural schools, and educational trips under the NSS Twinning Program, students promoted inclusive and quality education. School visits and collaborative activities further enhanced cross-learning and motivation among underprivileged children.
- **Women Empowerment and Social Equity:** Nukkad Nataks such as Shakti ki Udaan: Betiyan Banayein Mahaan, self-defense workshops, and International Women's Day celebrations highlighted issues of gender equality and women's empowerment. Sessions on sexual harassment awareness promoted safe and inclusive workplaces.

- **Environmental and Sustainability Initiatives:** Outreach programs addressed pressing issues of water conservation, recycling, waste management, and cleanliness drives under the Swachhata Hi Seva campaign. Drawing and essay competitions inspired creativity while sensitizing youth toward environmental protection.
- **Digital Literacy and Cyber Awareness:** Programs like Secure Your Digital World and Cyber Sentinel trained students and villagers in safe digital practices, while extension activities on media and information literacy built resilience against cyber fraud, misinformation, and unsafe online behavior.
- **Patriotism and National Integration:** Events such as Har Ghar Tiranga (flag distribution, Prabhat Pheri, art competitions), Republic Day celebrations, and Independence Day cultural programs fostered a spirit of unity and national pride.
- **Community Engagement:** Students extended compassionate support through visits to old age homes, assistance to women's self-help groups at Saras Mela, and donation drives for underprivileged communities. Long-duration village engagement projects focused on health, hygiene, and socio-cultural development.

Together, these initiatives reflect the university's unwavering dedication to the **United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)**, particularly those related to **good health and well-being, quality education, gender equality, environmental sustainability, and community development**. An amount **Rs. 8334300/-** was donated to charity to carry out community work. ## INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS OFFICE

Our university has taken steps in fostering global connections and opportunities. Furthermore, we take pride in offering short immersion programs that allow foreign students to explore India's rich heritage and culture first-hand. This year we have also launch 'Global Career Enhancement Certification Programs' in collaboration with a German university and the Sector Skills Council, Ministry of Finance, Government of India. Additionally, we are delighted to introduce new short immersion programs in countries like Australia, the UK, Singapore, Malaysia, Dubai, and Poland, tailored specifically for students in computer science, architecture, and management disciplines.

In our pursuit of global engagement, we have conducted a successful summer school on business and management at the University of Portsmouth, UK, in August 2023. Moreover, we have established over 15 active agreements and engagements with prestigious institutions such as Middlesex University UK, the University of Houston USA, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln USA, the University of Galway Ireland,

the University of Bath UK, the University of Sydney, the University of South Wales, Murdoch University, and Deakin University, to name a few.

The cohort of our students has recently completed an Immersion program at Middlesex University-UK, Dubai Campus in November 2024. ## **INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES**

K.R. Mangalam University continues to enhance its physical and digital infrastructure to support holistic teaching, learning, and research. The campus is equipped with 124 classrooms and 101 laboratories/studios, providing state-of-the-art environments for practical and theoretical learning. To facilitate modern pedagogical approaches, 75 ICT-enabled facilities—including smart panels and projectors—are integrated across classrooms and seminar halls.

The University also ensures convenient access to general facilities, including a dedicated fleet of 73 CNG buses that support eco-friendly transportation for students and staff. The Central Library remains a cornerstone of academic enrichment with a robust collection of 44,210 books, covering 11,901 titles. It subscribes to 82 print journals, including 54 national and 28**international journals**, thereby supporting the information needs of faculty, researchers, and students across disciplines.

As part of the University's commitment to IT integration in education, a total of **1702 computers** are available across academic and administrative blocks. The campus is supported by **71 printers**, **1200 LAN points**, and a **1 Gbps high-speed network**. Over **214 Wi-Fi access points** ensure seamless internet connectivity throughout the campus, enhancing digital learning experiences. With a **student-computer ratio of 4.17:1**, the institution maintains a highly favorable digital access environment.

The University has also invested in specialized academic and research infrastructure. Software such as **SPSS** is available for statistical analysis, supporting students and scholars in research-based learning.

Facilities such as the **Central Museum**, **Indian Knowledge System (IKS) Centre**, and **Art Gallery** promote interdisciplinary exploration and cultural engagement. The campus features a **4-lane athletic ground** as part of its commitment to physical education and wellness. Additionally, new equipment including **Differential Scanning Calorimeter (DSC)**, **LCR Meter**, **FTIR Spectrometer**, and **Muffle Furnace** have been procured under the Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF), strengthening the research ecosystem of the University. This continuous upgrading of infrastructure reflects the University's commitment to providing a high-quality, future-ready academic environment.

## SCHOOL OF BASIC AND APPLIED SCIENCES

During the academic session 2024–25, the School of Basic and Applied Sciences (SBAS) actively organized and participated in a wide spectrum of academic, professional, and community-oriented activities to promote holistic learning among students. The school conducted multiple **industrial and educational visits** including the Indian Institute of Packaging, New Delhi; JECRC University, Jaipur; and specialized visits such as mortuary training, enabling students to gain practical exposure. A strong emphasis was laid on **intellectual development through seminars, expert sessions, and conferences** covering diverse themes such as intellectual property rights, analytical techniques, professional ethics, gender sensitization, climate action, and quality assurance in higher education. The school also promoted **skill enhancement workshops** on communication, soft skills, digital forensics, and research analysis using Origin software. Engagement with **MoUs and collaborations** provided avenues for research projects, internships, and fieldwork with reputed organizations, NGOs, and academic institutions. In addition, **community outreach programs** were carried out, such as exploring the causes and management of malnutrition in pediatric populations in nearby villages. Alumni and inter-university engagement was strengthened through initiatives like *Fostering Future Minds, Journey Beyond Campus*, and the *Inter-University Science Fiesta 2025*. The school further contributed to faculty development by hosting a **Faculty Development Program on Indian Knowledge Systems** and an **International Conference on Advanced Materials for Green Chemistry and Sustainable Environment** under the aegis of IQAC. These multifaceted initiatives reflect the school's commitment to nurturing academic excellence, professional growth, social responsibility, and research innovation. ## **SCHOOL OF ARCHITECTURE AND DESIGN**



## SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURAL SCIENCES



## **SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY**

During the academic year 2024–25, the School of Engineering and Technology (SOET) organized a wide range of activities and events aimed at enhancing technical knowledge, practical skills, and holistic development of students. The school conducted multiple industrial visits, including to Hero Honda Group, Unibic Food Pvt. Ltd., Mathura Refinery, Network Bulls, and CDAC Noida, providing students with firsthand exposure to industry operations and practical applications of engineering concepts. 


