#### MERI MATI MERA DESH CAMPAIGN

The special Campaign 3.0 for improving Swachhata and disposal of pending public Grievances from 2nd October to 31st October 2023 is being launched by Govt of India on the lines of the Special Campaign held in 2021 and 2022 on the same theme. NSS K R Mangalam University, in collaboration with the Uboonto Foundation, Delhi, organized a one-day camp on 30th October 2023 as part of the Swachhata Campaign 3.0 in Lakhuwas village, Sohna. The comprehensive event included various activities such as a cleanliness drive at the Government School, a rally within the village, an expert-led awareness session on the reuse of waste materials, and a pledge ceremony involving Government School students. The NSS volunteers initiated the camp by cleaning the school campus, followed by a vibrant rally. To aware the women and girls about the menstruation cycle, NSS, K R Mangalam University organized an awareness session on "Menstrual Cycle: Let's Talk about it" as an extension activity at Anganwadi, Berka village on 23rd November 2023. The event was started by NSS volunteers Ms Muskan and Ms Simran where they briefed about the session. They told that in rural areas, many adolescent girls from rural areas of India are still not aware about issues related to menstruation and maintaining personal hygiene during this period and dealing with associated physical problems. They usually don't get a proper platform to get information or discuss such issues. During the session, all associated topics related to menstruation were explained

to adolescent girls and women, Traditional myths and misconceptions in rural areas related to menstruation were discussed.

# AN AWARENESS SESSION ON 'SEXUAL HARASSEMENT OF WOMEN AT WORKPLACE'

NSS, K R Mangalam University organized an awareness session on 'Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace' on 8th December 2023 in collaboration with Gender Sensitization and Safety Committee and S M Sehgal Foundation as Sexual Harassment at Workplace Prevention week (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013) from 4th -9th December 2023 is observing. During the session, there were 115 participants including NSS volunteers and employees of S M Sehgal Foundation. The session was in hybrid mode. The session was preceded by Dr Shobhna Jeet, Chairperson, Gender Sensitization and Safety Committee. She told the participants that Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, more commonly known as the PoSH Act, was enacted in 2013. The legislature aimed to prevent, prohibit, and provide redressal workplace sexual harassment. The intent of the law is to create a safe workplace for women

without their integrity getting impacted. The employees were also informed that those who underwent any kind of harassment can approach the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC). She also differentiated the myths and facts about Sexual Harassment at Workplace with live examples and clear view about the Act.

Dr. Kukreja preceded the event, shedding light on PCOD/PCOS as a prevalent hormonal disorder among women of reproductive age. She offered insights into PCOS symptoms, diagnosis, and management, emphasizing lifestyle modifications, medications, and fertility treatments. Participants expressed appreciation for the opportunity to engage in open discussions during the event.

The event was preceded by NSS volunteers where they informed the audience that Malaria is caused by a parasite which is called Plasmodium which infects and destroys the person's blood. They further explained that Malaria sickness is spread from person to person through the bites of infected female. Dr. Mina Kumari, NSS member expressed her gratitude to the audience as the participants expressed a willingness to continue practicing preventive measures and to share their knowledge with others in the community.

#### NUKKAD NATAK ON NATIONAL VOLUNTARY BLOOD DONATION DAY


GAURAV PANDEY B. TECH CSE (FSD




MITALI B. PT
