

#### Conclusion







#### LOK ADALAT 14.05.2022

Legal Aid Committee of K.R. Mangalam University in collaboration with District Legal Services Authority.

Target Group: Traffic Violence Settlement

Resources Person: Ms. Lalita Patwardhan, Chief Judicial Magistrate of District Legal Service Authority, Gurugram.

#### Introduction

On 14th May, 2022 The Legal Aid Committee of School of Legal Studies led by Assistant Professor Dharamveer Yadav at K.R. Mangalam University in association and accordance with the DLSA( District Legal Service Authority) organised a field visit to District & Sessions Court, Gurugram. The Purpose of the visit was to experience and volunteer the Lok Adalat.

#### **Objectives**

The Lok Adalat was organised with the following objectives amongst others:

- To provide speedy justice.
- To generate awareness amongst the public regarding the conciliatory mode of dispute settlement and legal sanctity of Lok Adalat.
- To gear up the process of organising Lok Adalat.
- To provide a supplementary to the mainstream legal system.
- To encourage the public to settle their cases outside the formal set-up.
- To empower the public to participate in the justice delivery system.

Content

K.R. Mangalam University orugram, (Haryana)

'Lok Adalat' is a system of conciliation or negotiation. It is also known as 'people's court'.

Lok Adalat is a forum where the cases (or disputes) which are pending in a court or which are at the pre-litigation stage are compromised or settled in an amicable manner.

The Supreme Court has explained the meaning of the institution of Lok Adalat in the following way:

The 'Lok Adalat' is an old form of adjudicating system that prevailed in ancient India and its validity has not been taken away even in modern days too. This system is based on Gandhian principles. As the Indian courts are overburdened with the backlog of cases involving lengthy, expensive and tedious procedures. The court takes years together to settle even petty cases. Lok Adalat, therefore, provides alternative resolution or devise for expeditious and inexpensive justice.

The purpose of the visit was to experience how Lok Adalat as a mechanism and a way of settlement works in society to deal with petty offences (Summary Cases) which falls under ambit of Alternate Dispute Resolution.

The visit by our team of 12 volunteers led to some great experiential learning as they got the opportunity to witness the hearings at hand and how the Lok Adalat works closely with and for the general public. Most of the cases were related to Traffic Rules violation, Excise Duty, Compromises and other petty issues. Students learnt about the Discretionary Powers of the judges in these matters as judges provided admonishment in some matters based on the situations. The cases were settled amicably and fast. The general public was seen appreciative of the presence of Lok Adalat.

The Students also take up the views of the Administrative Staff, Advocate and citizens. The Lok Adalat is the speedy justice systems. Lok Adalats have been given statutory status under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987. Under the said Act, the award (decision) made by the Lok Adalats is deemed to be a decree of a civil court and is final and binding on all parties and no appeal against such an award lies before any court of law. If the parties are not satisfied with the award of the Lok Adalat though there is no provision for an appeal against such an award, but they are free to initiate litigation by approaching the court of appropriate jurisdiction by filing a case by following the required procedure, in exercise of their right to litigate.

There is no court fee payable when a matter is filed in a Lok Adalat. If a matter pending in the court of law is referred to the Lok Adalat and is settled subsequently, the court fee originally paid in the court on the complaints/petition is also refunded back to the parties.

The persons deciding the cases in the Lok Adalats are called the Members of the Lok Adalats, they have the role of statutory conciliators only and do not have any judicial role; therefore they can only persuade the parties to come to a conclusion for settling the dispute outside the court in the Lok Adalat and shall not pressurize or coerce any of the parties to compromise or settle cases or matters either directly or indirectly. The Lok Adalat shall not decide the matter so referred at its own instance, instead the same would be decided on the basis of the compromise or settlement between the parties. The members shall assist the parties in an independent and impartial manner in their attempt to reach amicable settlement of their dispute.






Photo 2: Faculty, Guests and Students pursuing Journalism and Mass Communication.




Photo 1: Students participated in Technical Quiz Competition




Photo 2: Students participated in Type Racing Competition



















Picture 1: Faculty members and students-teachers of School of Education attending the session on National Education Day







contrasting and noticeable feature of this conference was the mode through which the sere to be presented. Instead of making the authors present their work via oral or Point presentation mode, they were to engage themselves in dialogue with each other and Secuss their work and findings. The basic idea behind engaging the presenters in dialogue the dialogue creates a spirit of wholeness to combat the usual approach of fragmentation and isolated specializations. To imbibe this very idea of dialogue in the paper presenters, a preexperience training session was kept on the 9th of February wherein the participants were artested towards this mode of paper presentation. The session started at 3 PM and the resource sesson for the session was Prof. Subhashini Passi, an experienced management consultant in behavioural sciences. She introduced the dialogue method to all the participants. Propagating the dea of Late. Prof. B.K. One of the major stages of these 6 phases of presentation is the 'Findings or Conclusion phase', each presenter gives her/his 'I findings' of their research. After each participant has given 'I findings', all the findings are carefully pooled and scrutinized into 'we findings'. This is the most important part of the engagement after which the recommendations and reflections are made. The way she explained this entire process and the way she took up the queries of the participants was too engaging and simplistic for the listeners.

Elaborating further, he said that NEP the issue of managing the risk of the right impact from individual to collective. KRMU, the importance of peace in all realms of life. He further added that KRMU is also planning to start a Peace club for a global peace exchange programme.

Prof. Dhanajay Joshi, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Delhi Teachers University, Delhi, India was invited for his keynote address. Mr Joshi threw light on the efforts of GERA in helping germinate new ideas for the future. He quoted that India has given leadership hope to the world highlighting the role of G 20 - One earth, One family, One future (Picture 4). The whole world is one family as is depicted in our ancient literature too. We have always believed in the maxim, 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam Sarve Bhavantu.' Prof. Joshi further talked about Riga Veda which emphasised 'Live for the Whole Society' i.e Loka Sukhino Bhavantu and Prithvi Shanti stating that we pray for everyone's well-being. However, we have always been the custodian of human values and service before self has been our motto. He quoted Vivekananda stating that when India was being taken for granted and we were not considered intellectual, it was Vivekanand who on 11th Sept 1893 gave his groundbreaking speech at the World's Parliament of Religions in which he introduced Hinduism to America and told the world what is actual Indian philosophy. However, today everyone is looking towards India - its concepts of well-being, peace and brotherhood. He mentioned that in the next 10 years, India, due to its revolutionary Education Policies will be a name to reckon with. And as educators, it's our duty to ensure that the NEP document comes to life. The focus has to be 'restrengthening and empowering' teachers. Quoting Kothari, he said that the "Teacher is the destiny maker" and this creator has to be taken care of. Though the irony is that we are producing accidental teachers, not intentional teachers. Teaching has to be considered as a service, teaching is mentoring, and coaching. Talking about world peace and holistic education, Prof. Joshi proclaimed that Peace is a state of mind. Quoting Mahatma Gandhi's axiom, 'Peer Parai' i.e. experiencing the pain of others, he stated that we have witnessed the consequence of war and what we need today is the theory of love and harmony.

After the keynote address by Prof. Joshi, Prof. (Dr.) Tania Gupta, Convener, EDUCON 2022 and Dean, School of Education, K.R Mangalam University, Gurugram, Haryana released E-Souvenior after seeking the blessings of the almighty and thanked the esteemed guests (Picture 5). She highlighted the features of the E-Souvenir mentioning that it is not just a book of abstracts but a book full of aspirations. She concluded by thanking all, especially the participants of 70 papers which will be deliberated in the 2 days conference.

After the release of the souvenir, Chief Guest, Prof. G. D. Sharma, Former Senior Fellow & Head, Higher Education Unit, NIEPA, Former Secretary of UGC, and Director for the Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC) was invited to the platform. He initiated the conversation by sharing his experience at the Seoul conference when 500 participants participated in Korea and the agenda of the conference was to highlight the contribution of education to recent development. He talked about the DNA scientist Watson and how science can help achieve peace in the world. He further illuminated why conflicts arise conflict in vision, the superiority of vision, and the superiority of how world views will be helpful to develop us from superiority to equality. He talked about Indian culture, which is the hallmark of our education and tried to understand the world-view. He stated that an understanding needs to seep down into our thinking process and our hearts and education can play a role in resolving conflicts. He also highlighted the concept of Peace, stating that peace doesn't arise from slogans or noise, peace arises from effective silence.

He emphasized the role of education which is to understand others, have a dialogue, and understand each other to achieve development. It's a diverse world and one must respect the views, work and ideas of others. Respecting diversity is important to appreciate the good things in the world and achieve equality.

He concluded that education has to be free for the larger interest of the people. He considered education to be separate from service. Moreover, diversity and the ability to think beyond immediate requirements is the need of today's educational spectrum and it's our responsibility to work together to contribute to the overall peace in the world.

Guest Speaker, Prof. (Dr.) Manjula, Chair of Educational Psychology, Colombo University, Sri Lanka, who is an expert in Interpersonal communication focussed on the efforts of the University of Colombo. Her views enlightened the audience about the pedagogical co-creations for holistic education- the beginning of the path towards world peace. She spoke about citizenship education as a subject from UNESCO where domains of learning have been well specified. She stressed the social and emotional aspects and led attention to the need for something beyond citizenship education (Picture 6).

She threw light upon content and delivery to make a significant impact on the learners. According to her, holistic education has a comprehensive approach and an integrated learning format. She urged that holistic education in today's scenario needs a pedagogy that values

relationships and that further challenges the role of a teacher for the implementation of these values. Co-Creation and Authentic Assessment along with performance assessment need to assess the real-world tasks to assess attitudes, empathy and values too.

At the end of the inaugural session, Prof. Tania proposed the vote of thanks. She thanked the Global Association Research Education (GERA) for their valuable and crucial contribution to a vision of a sustainable society to aim for freedom of expression and reduction of inequalities. She also thanked all the dignitaries for their kind words. She stressed that SDG-16 calls upon governments, civil society and communities to work together to find lasting solutions to conflicts and insecurity. The purpose of holistic education is not only to prepare students for academic success but also to enable them to learn the challenges of living as a whole.

#### PLENARY SESSION 1

Day 1

(11:40 AM - 12:45 PM)

For the plenary session 1, Prof. Saamdu Chetri, the director of Bhutan's GNH Center and an IIT Kharagpur visiting faculty member and Prof. (Dr.) Jaswinder K. Dhillon, University of Worcester, England, was the invited guest speaker. The session started at 12:20 hrs as per IST. Dr. Pooja Verma, Assistant Professor, School of Education, K.R. Mangalam University, welcomed both esteemed guests. Prof. Saamdhu in his lecture indicated that happiness is the first thing required for holistic development (Picture 7). He was of the view that mindfulness, love, joy, and peace are important parts of holistic education. He talked about the reality of life and the five elements of which the whole world is made up. He further threw light on the fact that conflict is an internal part of our lives these days, so a healthy outlook towards conflict needs to be achieved. Peace is the only light that can foster positive citizenship among our students. As peace educators, we are organically shaped and passionate about what we love. He made the audience ponder why there is a need for a paradigm shift. Peace is holistic and dynamic; it is very content-specific. He mentioned that peace is the absence of war, it is living in harmony. Relevant examples were cited from various countries including Somalia where peace is merely getting the next meal and India where peace education is intentional. A complete revamp of the curriculum is required to manage aggression among students. Thus, we need to start from the school level to achieve peace. He highlighted that our pedagogy should be peace-oriented and most importantly, the teacher is seen as a friend or aspa

facilitator rather than a leader. He also talked about the motto of G-20 i.e. one earth, one family, one future as the need today is that the benefits of development are universal and all-inclusive. Prof. Ranjan's motivational and inspirational words focused on the key message of respecting differences and marching forward with a common goal. He stressed the importance of openmindedness and working together in harmony.

Prof. (Dr.) Harjeet Kaur Bhatia, Department of Educational Studies, Jamia Milia Islamia, New Delhi, India congratulated GERA and KRMU on this great opportunity provided to experts and participants for sharing their views on holistic education and world peace. Prof. Harjeet commenced by mentioning holistic education and world peace as abstractions. It is a philosophy of love, caring, empathy and a process as it is the ultimate. She mentioned that education for peace is not about the content but it is a process to be achieved. We need to address the structural form of violence including all aspects like colour, easte, culture, and religion (Pieture 20).

Prof. Harjeet illuminated that the concept of peace education is the need to address differences, power, etc. She mentioned that in today's scenario the least heard voice is that of learners. It is our responsibility to ensure that positive peace is incorporated. Peace is the essence of self; it is a state of bliss. In her address, Prof. Harjeet referred to Norwegian philosopher John Walton who talks about negative peace as the absence of direct violence. Oppression is included in negative peace and is all around us. When we talk about peace, we do not have to talk about the cliched assumptions as superficial practice will lead to a world devoid of peace. We need to understand the condition and what ought to be; it is then we are working towards peace.

It is our responsibility to eliminate obstacles towards humanity. Understanding the various perspectives for peace is equally important. Peace has subjectivity - peace for one person might not be peace for another person. She made the audience consider that it's important to understand the perspectives of different religions also. Every religion talks about peace differently, for instance, Mahabharat states that you have to be vocal and you have to fight for your rights. Thus, peace has to be about one's culture.

She further elucidated what we need to do as educators - we need to move from I/me to WE, being as an individual and being as a society. She quoted the Dalai Lama who has consistently advocated peaceful and non-violent solutions to problems. She also referred to Mahatma Gandhi who envisioned peace in the revolutionary form of action and introduced satyagraha, to make people understand peace. All we need is critical appreciation, foster reflection, and give people the freedom of speech. She remarked that peace is discovered not created. She also threw

light on how educational institutions help practice peace and incorporate diversity. All the practices she mentioned need to be woven into the fabric of the institutions.

This was followed by a Q&A session wherein participants posed various questions to the eminent speakers, which strengthened the Conference's agenda and further proposed various strategies for holistic and peace education including flipped learning, multiculturalism, interculturalism, etc (Picture 21).

To sum it up, Prof. Tania Gupta presented her reflections by suggesting that there is a lot of preaching happening around us. We have had great philosophies theoretically but they are not present around us practically. Pedagogy must have more case studies. She also emphasised the role of parenting and made a special mention of the movie 3 idiots where children were treated like a marketplace. We are preparing children for a rat race in this insane world so the role of parenting plays an important role and teachers cannot do it all alone. Peace is also a life skill. The curriculum should teach about ethics and we as educators have to work to bring the children close to peace. Prof. Tania Gupta expressed her gratitude to all the participants and thanked the participants for the deliberations and valuable views. She conveyed her best wishes to the presenters of the next technical session.

At 11.30 AM, Technical Sessions started. There were 4 technical sessions and around 30 papers were presented and discussed.








Fig 4: Engaging the Students into Activities




Fig 5: Interacting with Students about their Experience





#### Content



It was an offline competition where the students came in traditional attire of any state of India and displayed the dish of the respective state. The students were judged on the basis of overall presentation.





Such events should be organized in future as well with more focus on inclusion of folks from all walks of life and the scope of the theme should be broadened wherein all the vulnerable people of the society should be taken into account.






### Conclusion:




