SJMC Conduct FDP on "Research: Statistics and Digital Tools (MS Excel)"

The Faculty Development Program will address research statistics and digital tools of MS Excel over the course of a single week. Eminent academics and practitioners in the field of the respective area will lead the programme. All the faculty members and research scholars of School of Journalism and Mass Communication and faculty members from other Schools of KR Mangalam University will participate in the program, which will be held in June, 2023. The FDP's goal is to equip faculty members with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively use the various digital tools available in Microsoft Excel and research statistics.

Programme Objective:

1. Enhancing faculty members' ability to use Excel for organizing and analysing data and basics of research statistics and statistical operations, 2. Introducing faculty members to advanced features and functions of Excel, such as macros, pivot tables, and data visualization tools, 3. E n a b l i n g faculty members to use Excel to create more dynamic and interactive learning materials, such as charts, graphs, and other visual aids, 4. Providing faculty members with hands-on training and practice in using digital tools in Excel to create effective teaching and learning resources, 5. Encouraging faculty members to incorporate digital tools in their teaching practices to enhance student engagement and learning outcomes.

Day 1-The programme started with an opening address by the Dean Prof. Dr. Neeraj Khattri, who emphasized the importance of research in academia and the need for faculty members to be equipped with the latest research tools. This was followed by a resource person Mr. Shivam Saraswat, Assistant Professor, SOET, who provided an overview of the fundamental concepts of MS Excel. The first day of the program was dedicated to introducing participants to the key concepts of research methodology, statistics, and the application of MS Excel in data analysis. The day began with a warm welcome and introduction to the program's objectives and structure. Participants were given an overview of the program's content and the importance of research, statistics, and digital tools in their professional development.

Day 2- Mr. Shivam Saraswat, an experienced expert in the field of data analysis and spread sheet applications. He highlighted the importance of MS Excel as a powerful tool for data analysis, management, and decisionmaking. Mr. Saraswat elaborated on arithmetic operators (+, -, *, /), comparison operators (<, >, =, <=, >=, <>), logical operators (AND, OR, NOT), and reference operators. He emphasized the significance of using these operators effectively to perform various calculations and comparisons within Excel.

Day 3-The focus of the day was on the topic "Basic Research -Statistics," which plays a crucial role in various research methodologies and data analysis techniques. The next segment focused on introducing key statistical concepts and terminology. Prof. Manchanda explained concepts such as population, sample, variables, measurement scales, and measures of central tendency (mean, median, mode) and dispersion (range, variance, standard deviation). Participants were encouraged to grasp these fundamental concepts as the building blocks of statistical analysis.

Day 4-The session focused on the topic "Statistical Operations in Research," which delved into the application of statistical techniques and operations to analyse and interpret research data. The session was conducted by the esteemed presenter, Prof. (Dr.) S.C. Manchanda, a renowned expert in the field of research methodology and statistical analysis. He emphasized the importance of statistical operations in research, enabling researchers to draw meaningful conclusions and make informed decisions based on empirical evidence. He explained the principles of hypothesis testing, significance levels, p-values, and the interpretation of test results.

Day 5- The focus of the day was on the topic "Data Validation, Pivot Table, and Charts," which explored techniques to ensure data accuracy, analyze data using pivot tables, and create visually appealing charts and graphs for effective data presentation. She highlighted the importance of data validation, pivot tables, and charts in data analysis and effective communication of research findings. The session began with an introduction to data validation, which ensures the accuracy and reliability of data. Dr. Bansal explained different types of data validation rules, such as range, list, and custom validation.

Day 6- The focus of the day was on the topic "Web Scraping and Data Wrangling," which explored techniques to extract data from websites and process it for further analysis. Dr. Rajput, an expert in the field of data science and analytics, shared his expertise and insights with the participants. Dr. Rajput explained the basics of web scraping, including HTML structure, CSS selectors, and XPath expressions. Participants gained an understanding of the ethical considerations and legal aspects associated with web scraping. He emphasized the increasing importance of web scraping and data wrangling in extracting valuable information from online sources and preparing it for analysis.

SOET organized guest lecture on Constitutional obligations: values, rights, duties and responsibilities of citizens

20th April, 2023, School of Engineering and Technology, K.R. Mangalam University, Gurugram organized a one-day educational session for undergraduate students of K. R. Mangalam University on April 20, 2023. The lecture on Constitutional obligations by Ms. Gargi Singh explores the crucial aspects of citizenship, emphasizing the values, rights, duties and responsibilities present within a constitution. Its aims to provide a comprehensive understanding of the fundamental principles that guide the relationship between the state and its citizens. She also insisted that by recognizing these obligations, citizens can actively participate in shaping and uploading a just and inclusive society. The lecture commenced by highlighting the significance of constitutional values. These values serve as the foundation for a democratic society and

include principles such as equality, justice, liberty, fraternity, and secularism. She also emphasized the importance of rights granted to citizens in a constitution. These rights may include but are not limited to freedom of speech, expression, religion, assembly, and the right to life, liberty, and property. Citizens have the responsibility to exercise their rights responsibly while respecting the rights of others. They can advocate for their rights, challenge injustices, and actively participate in the democratic process. The lecture highlighted the importance of responsible citizenship, such as promoting social justice, respecting diversity, preserving the environment, volunteering, and actively engaging in civil society initiatives.

During the lecture, Ms. Gargi also provides historical and contemporary examples to illustrate the practical application of these constitutional obligations. Additionally, fostering an interactive environment where participants asked questions and engage in discussions to deepen their understanding. The outcome of this lecture on constitutional obligations was to educate the students about the values, rights, duties, arid responsibilities of citizens within a constitutional framework. To explain everyone that how these values shape the principles and functioning of constitutional democracy. To highlight the civic duties and responsibilities that citizens are expected to fulfill. These may include obeying laws, paying taxes, serving on juries, and defending the country when required and emphasize the significance of active participation and responsible citizenship in upholding the social contract.

SOET organized Youth Talk students speech Competition on Language and Communication Skill

3rd May 2023, SOET organized a Youth Talk student's speech Competition on Language and Communication Skill. The event was divided into three stages namely, extempore, story-telling and group discussion. She emphasized on trade secrets. Trade secrets are confidential information that gives a company a competitive advantage. Trade secrets can include formulas, recipes, customer lists, and manufacturing processes. Overall, IPR plays a crucial role in protecting

The participants were taught about the role of agricultural journalists in communicating news and information to farmers, officers, and other stakeholders. Agricultural Journalists are very helpful to undertake mass campaigns on agricultural programs, schemes, technologies, pest control, and marketing issues especially when time is very short and coverage is more.

Dr. Meenakshi, explained to the students that Agri-Journalism is otherwise known as Farm journalism and it plays great role in communication with farm people, homemakers, etc. Newspaper stories, magazine article, leaflets, pamphlets, bulletins, circular letters, wall newspapers and radio scripts are increasingly being written by the extension staff and read or listened to. The written work is helping to

make advisory work with farm people more interesting. It covers a wide range of subject areas, assessing all stages from agricultural research and production to processing, marketing, consumption, nutrition and health. The training of agriculture journalist is similar to traditional journalist, except that they bring with them an understanding of agricultural systems. Thus, agricultural journalism is an applied theoretical field which is slowly emerging as a rewarding career option. The word journalism is derived from Journal which means a daily register or a diary. Thus, Journalism means the communication of information regarding the events of day through written word s, sounds or pictures.

Principles of Agri-Journalism

Our purpose in writing is to communicate the information. Therefore, our first consideration is our reader audience. If you were writing for a scientific paper, you would use a vocabulary and style different from what you would use when writing for the general public. How clearly you communicate information to average readers depends on how well you select, sift and sort your facts.

Nature of Agri-Journalism

Journalism is the timely reporting of events at the local, regional, national and international levels. Reporting involves the gathering of information through interviewing and research, the results of which are turned into fair and balanced story for publication or for television or radio broadcast. Distribution of news and views about the society. Additionally, the students indulged in a simulative fanner journalist interactive session. They were divided into groups and were given different situations where they enacted as differently, one of them was a reporter while others were media person, camera man, farmers, other people from the village and so on. The workshop continued where the students enacted in their groups and experienced the real time interaction while learning the entire process with the principle and emotions behind it.
