



BRINGING LIGHT TO EXCELLENCE

The School of Basic and Applied Sciences (SBAS)

at K.R. Mangalam University (KRMU), Gurugram, has been a cornerstone of academic and research excellence since its establishment in 2013. With a highly qualified team of 39 faculty members (30 doctorate faculty members and 19 NET-qualified), the school continues to drive innovation and impart quality education.







■ Academic Initiatives

SBAS offers a wide range of undergraduate and post graduate programs in Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and Forensic Sciences. The program curricula have been designed in accordance with NEP-2020 and include core courses, minor courses, value-added courses, skill-based courses and provides an opportunity to students to connect with industry through internships and projects. We offer four streams of minor courses in Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning (AI-ML), Nanosciences, Environmental Sciences and Data Sciences to promote technological integration and skills amongst students. These programs demonstrate the school's dedication to meeting the demands of the National Education Policy. The courses also encourage the students to apply their skillsin cultivating creativity, problem-solving, and critical thinking.

■ Key Achievements

Research

The faculty of the School of Basic and Applied Sciences has achieved remarkable milestones in research. Dr. Seema Raj was awarded ₹1.56 crore by DST for the KRMU KEIC STI HUB. The faculty members (Dr. Rishi Ranjan, Dr. Ritika Khattri, Dr. Rajni Gautam and Dr. Neeraj Kumari) received ₹7.8 lakh as a seed grant for pursuing innovative research in areas of material science.

SBAS also has an impressive research record, with 10 patents, 432 book chapters, 104 books, and 50 publications in 2023-24, featuring work in top journals like *Sensors and Actuators* (IF: 8) and *International Journal of Biological Macromolecules* (IF: 7.7).

Awards

Dr. Komal Yadav, Dr. Neeraj Kumari, and Dr. Chandra Mohan were honored for their outstanding contributions to community service.

Student's Accomplishments

Students achieved remarkable success in various competitions. Aryan and Sannah secured the first position at GD Goenka University in the interuniversity Elevator Pitch Entrepreneurial Debate Competition held in March 2024 and in the Smart Ideathon Competition at KRMU held in January 2024. Shikha, Ritu, and Vivek secured second place in the Science-Fiesta 2024 at KRMU. Ms. Prakarti won first place in the speech competition, while Ms. Nadini was recognized as a top poet (15th Place among top 1000 poet in India) in the National Poetry Competition organized by S7 India.

Collaborations

MoUs with prestigious institutions like Deshbandhu College, Gargi College, Shivaji College (University of Delhi) and RJ Forsec Pvt Ltd, Delhi were signed

to facilitate workshops, seminars, internships, conferences, faculty development programs and research. SBAS organized the 1st International Conference on Advanced Materials for Green Chemistry **Sustainable Environment** and in collaboration with Indian Science Congress Association (ISCA) Rohtak Chapter and International Association for Advanced Materials (IAAM) Sweden on 15-16 February 2024. and a one-week Faculty Development Program (FDP) under Mahatma Hansraj- Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (MHMMTTC), New Delhi, on Fabrication and Characterization of Nanomaterials For Device Applications from 27th May to 1st June 2024 attracting over 100 participants.

■ Community Engagement

Various initiatives such as literacy programs for women, and a de-addiction campaign in nearby adopted Villages were carried out to provide social connect to the students. Additionally, a study on the effects of electronic devices on education involved 50 volunteer university students and 600 students from Abhaypur and Dhaula Villages.

The School of Basic and Applied Sciences continues to set benchmarks in education, research, and community outreach, fostering a holistic development environment for students and faculty alike.

Collaborations and field visits to premier institutions immerse students in real-world pharmaceutical practices. Health camps and industrial visits provide hands-on exposure, while projects like molecular docking workshops enhance critical thinking and problem-solving skills.

Collaborating with the International Centre for Stem Cells, Cancer & Biotechnology (ICSCCB), KRMU promotes transformative research and skill-building initiatives, including workshops on molecular docking. Through internships in hospitals, the pharmaceutical industry, and research institutions, students have significantly improved their practical skills, research acumen, and overall comprehension of the pharmaceutical field.

The National Conference on "Current Paradigms in Cancer Theranostics" showcased innovative cancer research and fostered interdisciplinary collaboration, preparing students to address emerging challenges in healthcare.

Field visits to institutions like CSIR-IGIB and Translational Health Science and Technology Institute provided students with hands-on experience in pharmaceutical technology, quality

Ltd. offered exposure to probiotics, Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP), and quality control, inspiring students to pursue innovation and excellence in healthcare and biotechnology. SMAS organized a health camp addressing anaemia in rural communities, providing free screenings, consultations, and supplements to improve public health awareness. The camp emphasized the importance of nutrition and preventive care, fostering community engagement and enabling students to apply theoretical knowledge in real-world settings, thus enhancing their clinical and interpersonal skills.

SMAS aims to expand collaborations with global institutions, enhancing interdisciplinary workshops and internships. Plans include advanced hands-on training in areas like AI in drug



RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CELL

K. R. Mangalam University, Gurugram

The Research at K.R. Mangalam University, Gurugram, was initiated in 2013 with the aim of fostering a robust research culture among students and faculty members. Situated within a university known for its commitment to quality education and interdisciplinary learning, the RDC is instrumental in supporting research initiatives, facilitating funding opportunities, and encouraging innovation across various academic fields. The Research and Development Cell aims to foster a strong









research culture by encouraging faculty and students to undertake impactful projects. It assists in securing funding from governmental and private agencies, including seed grants for initiating research. The cell promotes interdisciplinary collaboration across the university and supports the publication of research in reputed journals and conferences to enhance visibility. The cell is also responsible for the PhD. Program, research facilities, consultancies, research policy and committee formation etc. Additionally, it organizes workshops, seminars, and training sessions to develop research skills among students and faculty.

In 2024, K. R. Mangalam University achieved significant milestones in research and innovation. The university recorded 238 journal article publications, 545 books, 478 book chapters, and 108 conference proceedings. Additionally, 103 patents were granted and published, reflecting the institution's commitment to intellectual property development. In the domain of funded research, two government-funded projects were secured, with a total grant amounting to 176.38 lakh, further strengthening the university's research capabilities and contributions to academic excellence. Furthermore, the university provided seven seed grants totaling 16.86 lakh to support early-stage research, strengthening its research ecosystem and academic excellence.

PAGANISM: ECHOES OF ANCIENT TRADITIONS IN THE AZTEC CIVILIZATION

AN INTRODUCTION TO PAGANISM AND THE GREAT AZTEC CIVILIZATION.

Since the dawn of time, men have always believed in a higher being, a spirit, universe and even aliens and planets who should be worshipped for, they keep this world orderly and balanced. Paganism is one such broad concept that has shaped our society and its practices. Paganism is a diverse and ancient form of spirituality that consists of a variety of practices such as polytheism (worshipping multiple deities), nature worshipping (feeling a deep connection to nature and viewing it as spiritual), animism (believing that landscape, animals and natural objects possess a spirit), rituals and festivals and mythology to instil moral values amongst the followers. The beginning of paganism is not known or specified but it is believed that multiple civilisations have practiced paganism in one or the other form and it has naturally evolved over thousands of years. One such prominent ancient civilisation is the Aztec civilisation of Mexico. Initially, believed to be a nomadic tribe called Mexica, the Aztec civilisation is considered to be one of the most influential and important culture in Mesoamerica. They were known for their complicated social structures and rich culture and traditions. The social structure of the Aztecs was very structured and had hierarchy-based society. The emperor was known as the Tlatoani and then came the nobles, warriors, merchants and the common men. For the Aztecs, their religion was extremely important. The Aztecs practiced polytheism which is the practice of worshipping multiple gods or deities that were all associated with different aspects of life. They had rituals and ceremonies for their deities and would also sacrifice humans to appease the deities. Some of the most important deities of the Aztecs are:

Huitzilopochtli: The god of war and sun and the patron deity of the Aztec capital, Tenochtitlan

Quetzalcoatl: The feathered serpent god who was associated with knowledge, wind and creation

Tlaloc: The god of rain, fertility and water and was considered to be extremely important for agriculture.

In this article, we will be discussing about the effects of paganism on the Aztec society in brief.

ROOTS OF PAGANISM IN THE AZTEC SOCIETY

For the Aztecs, religion was extremely important for it helped in shaping their society and its complex social structure. Their belief in their gods was so strong that they'd even go as far as sacrificing their fellow humans to appease the deities as many of the deity rituals called for a human sacrifice.

Like mentioned earlier, the Aztec society was highly structured and complicated. They had a deeprooted love for religion and it could be seen in all aspects of their society.

In their society, the priest was the most respected and important figure as the people believed that they were the chosen ones and were highly favoured by the deities. They belonged to the elite section of the society and wielded great power over the political and religious matters. Sacrifices, which were extremely common in the Aztec society were performed by the priests in ceremonies as it was believed that the gods would bless and protect the land and its people.

The kings were called Tlatoani and they were seen as godly figures who were responsible for maintaining order and harmony. A lot of the decisions made by Tlatoani were influenced by religion and it was believed that the more successful a ruler's reign was, the more favoured he was by the gods.

(It should be noted that kings and nobles were often deeply involved in the religious practices and ceremonies.)

The Aztecs built grand pyramid like structures and

temples to honour the gods and worship them. Their architectural structure revealed that not only did religion play a huge role in their administration, it also played a significant role in their architecture. They also had sacred spaces designated for ceremonies and rituals, indicating the grandness and importance of rituals and ceremonies. One such famous structure is the Templo Mayor for Huitzilopochtli and Tlaloc.

In their daily life, the effect of paganism could be seen as the people would study subjects like astronomy to understand the celestial movement and form calendars. Religious training was also promoted as the mythology, religious texts and rituals could be passed down from one generation to another.

In warfare as well, the effects could be seen as the Aztecs would wage wars to capture prisoners in order

to sacrifice them to the gods to keep them happy and every win was celebrated with ceremonies.

CONCLUSION

Paganism was the essence and foundation of the Great Aztec civilisation. It influenced their society in every way and its effects can still be seen today among its remaining followers. Their practice had played an integral role in shaping their social structure and hierarchy, politics, architecture and has provided a deep sense of understanding amongst us that we are not very different from them and that the echoes of paganism can still be felt, even in our modern society.

MARITAL RAPE

" A single stroke of Sindoor cannot allow any man to do anything with his wife"

#Introduction

"Marriage is not a license for abuse, consent is mandatory, always".

In The recent Act of Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita which replaced The IPC of 1860 in India; Marital rape still has not been recognised as an offence and will continue to come under the ambit of domestic violence. In today's world where almost 100 countries have considered marital rape an offence; India continues to remain in the list of rest 36 nations, where forced sexual intercourse done by a married men with his wife is not considered an offence. This article aims to throw light on the historical background behind such beliefs, Arguments in favour and against of criminalising the marital rape, case laws and relevant Supreme court guidelines.

Historical Background-

During 1900 BCE, In Babylonia(a city) located at central southern Mesopotamia, a man can be sentenced to death if found or believed to have had sexual intercourse with another man's wife or daughters.

In ancient times, an act of rape with a Women was treated as "crime against the property" of their father or husband and not against the women individually.

The Doctrine of Coverture is to be held responsible for such belief, according to this doctrine, a woman had no independent legal identity of her own ever, before her marriage her father is to be considered as her owner and after marriage her identity was merged with that of her husband.

Later, in 1800s, when India was under the influence of British Empire, IPC was passed by the First Law Commission; which recognised offences of sexual violation, physical abuses, rape and other such offences as "crime against women", heavily criticising the idea of women being treated as

mere properties of their husband and father and successfully establishing independent legal identity of a women.

But the concept of "marital rape" was still not touched by the then jurists and law makers based on the beliefs of Hale's Doctrine, which suggested-

"Husband can't be guilty of rape. By their mutual matrimonial consent and contract, the wife has given up herself in the institution of marriage to the husband"

Section 375 of IPC (1870) was heavily influenced by these doctrines and The BNS (Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita) Act of 2024 continues to present women as weaker sex.

Data Analysis-

- About 70 per cent of women in India are victims of domestic violence. National Crime Records Bureau's (NCRB) 'Crime in India' 2019 reported that a woman is raped every 16 minutes and every four minutes, she experiences cruelty at the hands of her in-laws.
- National Family Health Survey (NFHS) 2015-16 data indicates that an estimated 99.1 per cent of sexual violence cases go unreported and that the average Indian woman is 17 times more likely to face sexual violence from her husband than from others.
- According to one study by the UN Population Fund, more than two-thirds of married women in India, between the ages of 15 to 49 have been beaten, raped, or forced to provide sex.

Arguements in favour-

(1) Violation of Article 14-

Article 14 establishes equality before law and provides equal protection of laws to all citizens. However, non- recognition of marital rape results in discrimination of women on the grounds of being married or unmarried. It is being presumed that a

married women cannot be subjected to rape by her own husband, and that being married signifies her "implied consent" to indulge in all kinds of sexual activities.

(2) Section 498(a) does not suffice-

section 498(a) reads as-

"Whoever, being the husband or the relative of the husband of a woman, subjects such woman to "cruelty" shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years and shall also be liable to fine."

Effects of marital rape has more severe and longlasting consequences for woman because of the simple fact that the rapist is none other than her own husband. There are physical effects and psychological effects which many of them are unable to overcome and makes such a woman spend her life in trauma. Do these milder and unspecified laws actually provide the necessary relief?

(3) Violation of Right to autonomy under article 21-

Justice Rajiv Shakdher, Delhi High Court, states that the right to withdraw consent from having sexual activity forms the core of women's right to life and liberty.

Hence, the concept of marital rape, where a wife is forced to serve a perpetual consent to have sex with her, which means girls, and women who are married have no individual rights like-

- Right to say NO
- Right to live with human dignity
- Right to make choices
- Right to privacy
- Right to life and personal liberty
- Right against inhuman treatment
- Right to health

the abovementioned rights are covered under the purview of "ARTICLE 21" which assures an individual

protection of life and their personal liberty.

Arguements against the criminalisation of marital rape -

- (1) In Delhi High Court in January 2022, the Union Government stated that "criminalising rape would thwart the marriage institution and become an easier way for harassing spouses."
- (2) Justice Dipak Misra, the former Chief Justice of India, suggested that "in my opinion, marital rape should not be regarded as a crime in India, as it will create anarchy in families, and our country relies on its family platform for its success of upholding family values."
- (3) Women may feel pressured to report marital rape due to social stigma, child impact, and family shame.
- 4) The wife's testimony is often the only whole sole evidence of the rape.
- (5) There may have been consensual sexual activity between the spouses before the rape, so DNA or semen samples would be irrelevant.
- (6)Both the husband and wife would have engaged in sexual relations frequently, it is almost impossible to prove the presence of consent each and everytime.

Relevant case laws

- (1)According to the Supreme Court in State of Karnataka vs Krishnappa (1993), "sexual violence, as well as being humiliated, is an unlawful intrusion into the privacy and sanctity of a woman. Likewise, the court ruled that non-consensual sexual interaction amounts to physical and sexual violence."
- (2) In Suchita Srivastava vs Chandigarh Administration (2009), the Supreme Court equated the right to choose a sexual activity with Article 21 (right to personal liberty, privacy, dignity, and bodily integrity).
- (3) The Supreme Court recognised the right to privacy of all citizens in Justice K.S. Puttuswamy vs Union of India (2017). An important aspect of


privacy is decision-making privacy, particularly when it comes to decisions about one's sexuality, procreation, or intimate relations.

(4) In Joseph Shine vs Union of India (2018), Justice Chandrachud posed the question of whether a woman or a man loses sexual autonomy when they marry. I think 'no'. In addition, he noted that "the right to refuse sex should also exist after marriage."

Conclusion-

Can sheer procedural or evedentiary concerns stop law from recognising such a henious offence. There are challanges for sure and equal regard should be paid to the rights of the accused or men. But the procedural concerns cannot overtake the principled approach that the law must take. The slow and delayed pace of litigation, corruption, inefficiency within the police machinery has dampened the spirit of many other laws too. false allegations can be made by anyone on any offence. procedural concerns should not be used as a weapon to assert the mysoginist notion that women lie, and their statements are unreliable. The real concerns of safeguarding the rights of the accused should be met with legislative and judicial expertise. only a smart legislative approach can address the evidentiary and procedural concerns and hence,




